# Chapter 1. Introduction

The Louisiana Oil Spill Contingency Plan is the manual by which the state will operate in dealing with the unauthorized discharge of oil within the State of Louisiana. This plan has been developed with the advice and input of state trustee agencies and the public.

## A. Authority and Public Policy

### A.1 Federal Authority

Section 4202 of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA 90) amended Subsection (j) of Section 311 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (FWPCA) (33 U.S.C. 1321 (j)) to address the development of a National Planning and Response System. As part of this system, Area Committees are to be established for each area designated by the President. These Area Committees are to be comprised of qualified personnel from Federal, State, and local agencies. Each Area Committee, under the direction of the Federal On-Scene Coordinator (OSC) for the area, is responsible for developing an Area Contingency Plan (ACP) which, when implemented in conjunction with the National Contingency Plan (NCP), shall be adequate to remove a worst case discharge of oil or a hazardous substance, and to mitigate or prevent a substantial threat of such a discharge, from a vessel, offshore facility, or onshore facility operating in or near the geographic area. Each Area Committee is also responsible for working with State and local officials to pre-plan for joint response efforts, including appropriate procedures for mechanical recovery, dispersal, shoreline cleanup, protection of sensitive environmental areas, and protection, rescue, and rehabilitation of fisheries and wildlife. The Area Committee is also required to work with State and local officials to expedite decisions for the use of dispersants and other mitigating substances and devices.

The functions of designating areas, appointing Area Committee members, determining the information to be included in Area Contingency Plans, and reviewing and approving Area Contingency Plans have been delegated by Executive Order 12777 of 22 October 1991, to the Commandant of the U.S. Coast Guard (through the Secretary of Transportation) for the coastal zone, and to the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency for the inland zone. The term "coastal zone" is defined in the current NCP (40 CFR 300.5) to mean all United States waters subject to the tide, United States waters of the Great Lakes, specified ports and harbors on inland rivers, and the waters of the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ). The Coast Guard has designated as areas, those portions of the Captain of the Port (COTP) zones which are within the coastal zone, for which Area Committees will prepare Area Contingency Plans. The COTP zones are described in Coast Guard regulations (33 CFR Part 3).

### A.2 State Authority

The office of the Louisiana oil spill Coordinator was created by the Louisiana Legislature in 1991 within the office of the governor. The office is administered by the Coordinator who is appointed by the governor, subject to Senate confirmation. The Coordinator is mandated to perform a number of tasks including:

- Develop a statewide oil spill prevention and response plan, taking into account the rules being developed by the federal government in accordance with the federal Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (P.L. 101-380) and similar plans being developed by other states.

- Provide a coordinated response effort from all appropriate state agencies in the event of an unauthorized or threatened discharge of oil affecting or potentially affecting the land, coastal waters, or any other waters of Louisiana.
- Coordinate the operational implementation and maintenance of the oil spill prevention program as provided in this Chapter.
- Administer a fund to provide for funding these activities.
- Provide clear delineation for state coordinated response efforts in relation to jurisdictional authorities and use of state and federal funds for removal costs under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (42 U.S.C. § 9601 et seq.), Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. § 321 et seq.), and the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (P.L. 101-380).

## B.2 Definitions

**Barrel** - means forty-two United States gallons at sixty degrees Fahrenheit.

**Black Oil** - Oil that is very black and sometime appearing latex in texture. Often confused with kelp beds and other natural phenomena.

**Brown Oil** - Typically a 0.1 mm to 1.0 mm thick layer of water-in-oil emulsion. Thickness can vary widely depending on wind and current conditions.

**Coastal waters** - means the waters and bed of the Gulf of Mexico within the jurisdiction of the state of Louisiana, including the arms of the Gulf of Mexico subject to tidal influence, estuaries, and any other waters within the state if such other waters are navigated by vessels with a capacity to carry ten thousand gallons or more of oil as fuel or cargo.

**Contamination** - The contact or impact of an impure substance.

**Convergence Zone** - The interface between two different types of water bodies which can collect a lot of floating debris including oil.

**Coordinator** - means the Louisiana oil spill Coordinator.

**Crude oil** means any naturally occurring liquid hydrocarbon at atmospheric temperature and pressure coming from the earth, including condensate.

**Damages** means and includes any of the following:

**Natural resources** - damages for injury to, destruction of, loss of, or loss of use of, natural resources as defined in this Section, including the reasonable costs of assessing the damages, which shall be recoverable by the state of Louisiana.

**Revenues** - damages equal to the net loss of taxes, royalties, rents, fees, or net profit share due to the injury, destruction, or loss of immovable or corporeal movable property, or natural resources, which shall be recoverable by the state of Louisiana.

**Public services** - damages for net costs of providing increased or additional public services during or after removal activities, including protection from fire, safety, or health hazards, caused by a discharge of oil, recoverable by the state of Louisiana or any of its political subdivisions.

**Deepwater port** is a facility licensed in accordance with the Deepwater Port Act of 1974 (33 U.S.C. 1501-1524).

**Discharge of oil** means an intentional or unintentional act or omission by which harmful quantities of oil are spilled, leaked, pumped, poured, emitted, or dumped into or on coastal waters of the state or at any other place where, unless controlled or removed, they may drain, seep, run, or otherwise enter coastal waters of the state.

**Discharge cleanup organization** means any group or cooperative, incorporated or unincorporated, of owners or operators of vessels or terminal facilities and any other persons who may elect to join, organized for the purpose of abating, containing, removing, or cleaning up pollution from discharges of oil or rescuing and rehabilitating wildlife or other natural resources through cooperative efforts and shared equipment, personnel, or facilities. Any third-party cleanup contractor, industry cooperative, volunteer organization, or local government shall be recognized as a discharge cleanup organization, provided the Coordinator properly certifies the organization.

**Dispersion** - The break up and scatter of oil (usually by wave and wind action).

**Dissolution** - The process of oil dissolving in the water column.

**Emergency** means an emergency declared by the governor in accordance with state law.

**Emulsification** - The process of forming a stable substance produced by the mixing of two substances. This stable substance normally cannot be reverted to its parts. Oil when mixed with water produces an emulsion often referred to as mousse.

**Facility** means any structure, group of structures, equipment, or device other than a vessel which is used for one or more of the following purposes: exploration for, drilling for, producing, storing, handling, transferring, processing, or transporting oil. This term includes any motor vehicle, rolling stock, or pipeline used for one or more of these purposes.

**Federal fund** means the federal Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund.

**Free (or mobile) oil** - Oil which can refloat when water is applied (as in high tide)

**Fund** means the Oil Spill Contingency Fund.

**Harmful quantity** means that quantity of oil the discharge of which is determined by the Coordinator to be harmful to the environment or public health or welfare or may reasonably be anticipated to present an imminent and substantial danger to the public health or welfare.

**Hotline** means the emergency telephone number established in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter to respond to a threatened or unauthorized discharge of oil.

**Leading Edge** - A distinct advancing edge of an oil slick.

**Light Sheen** - A light, almost transparent layer of oil. Sometimes confused with the wind effect on waves (windrows) and natural sheen resulting from biological processes.

**Marine terminal** means any terminal facility within the state of Louisiana used for transferring crude oil to or from vessels.

**Mousse** - Water-in-oil emulsion often formed as oil weathers; colors range from orange or tan to dark brown.

**Mousse Streaks** - Dark colored oil with obvious textured appearance oriented in lines or streaks. Brown oil and mousse can be easily confused with algae scum collecting in convergent lines, algae patches, or mats of kelp or fungus.

**National contingency plan** means the plan prepared and published, as revised from time to time, under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. § 1321 et seq.) and the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (42 U.S.C. § 9601 et seq.).

**Natural resources** means all land, fish, shellfish, fowl, wildlife, biota, vegetation, air, water, groundwater supplies, and other similar resources owned, managed, held in trust, regulated, or otherwise controlled by the state.

**Oil** means oil of any kind or in any form, including but not limited to crude oil, petroleum, fuel oil, sludge, oil refuse, and oil mixed with wastes other than dredged spoil, but does not include petroleum, including crude oil or any fraction thereof, which is specifically listed or designated as a hazardous substance under Subparagraphs (A) through (F) of Section 101(14) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (42 U.S.C. § 9601 et seq.) and which is subject to the provisions of that Act.

**Oil spill** shall have the same meaning as discharge of oil as defined in this Section.

**Oily Residue** - A product resulting from the weathering of oil leaving behind an asphaltic appearance to the oil. Often referred to as black oil.

**Owner or operator** means:

Any person owning, operating, or chartering by demise a vessel; or

- (a) Any person owning a terminal facility, excluding a political subdivision of the state that as owner transfers possession and the right to use a terminal facility to another person by lease, assignment, or permit; or;
- (b) A person operating a terminal facility by lease contract, or other form of agreement.

**Pancakes** - An isolated patch of oil shaped in a mostly circular fashion. Pancakes can range in size from a few meters across to hundreds of meters in diameter. Sheen may or may not be present.

**Penetration** - Downward extent of oil, usually into sediments.

**Persistent Oil** - Oil that does not decompose rapidly by environmental action.

**Person in charge** means the person on the scene who is directly responsible for a terminal facility or vessel when a threatened or unauthorized discharge of oil occurs or a particular duty arises under this Chapter.

**Person responsible**, responsible person, or responsible party means:

- The owner or operator of a vessel or terminal facility from which an unauthorized discharge of oil emanates or threatens to emanate.
- In the case of an abandoned vessel or terminal facility, the person who would have been the responsible person immediately prior to the abandonment.
- Any other person, but not including a person or entity who is rendering care, assistance, or advice in response to a discharge or threatened discharge of another person, who causes, allows, or permits an unauthorized discharge of oil or threatened unauthorized discharge of oil.

**Plan** means the state oil spill contingency plan.

**Pollution** means the presence of harmful quantities of oil in waters of the state or in or on adjacent shorelines, estuaries, tidal flats, beaches, or marshes.

**Pooled Oil** - Oil that collects in an enclosed area.

**Rainbow Sheen** - Sheen that reflects colors.

**Recontamination** - Contamination by oil of an area that was previously cleaned.

**Removal costs** means, with respect to an actual or threatened discharge of oil, all costs incurred in an attempt to prevent, abate, contain, and remove pollution from the discharge, including costs of removing vessels or structures under this Chapter, and costs of any reasonable measures to prevent or limit damage to the public health, safety, or welfare, public or private property, or natural resources.

**Sedimentation** - The process of oil adsorbing to sediments and sinking to the bottom of a waterbody.

**Sheen** - A thin layer of oil that is often transparent, glossy and is faintly noticeable.

**Silver Sheen** - A slightly thicker layer of oil that appears silvery or shimmery.

**Skinning** - A phenomena in which the surface of oil becomes darker and somewhat rusty as the lighter fractions evaporate away.

**Soil Penetration** - The percolation of oil into a soil substrate.

**Streamer** - A narrow line of oil, mousse, or sheen with clean water on either side.

**Tank vessel** - means a vessel that is constructed or adapted to carry, or that carries, oil or hazardous material in bulk as cargo or cargo residue, and that:

- Is a vessel of the United States;
- Operates on the navigable waters; or
- Transfers oil or hazardous material in a place subject to the jurisdiction of the State of Louisiana.

**Tar Balls** - Weathered oil that has formed a pliable ball. Size may vary from pinhead to about 10 cm. Sheen may or may not be present.

**Tar Mats** - Mats of oily debris (usually sediment and/or plant matter) that are found on beaches or just offshore.

**Tar Patties** - Small circular accumulation of oil greater than 10 cm in diameter. Often mixed with sea grasses and debris and found on the shoreline

**Terminal facility** means any waterfront or offshore pipeline, structure, equipment, or device used for the purposes of drilling for, pumping, storing, handling, or transferring oil and operating where a discharge from the facility could threaten waters of the state,

including but not limited to any such facility owned or operated by a public utility or a governmental or quasi-governmental body.

**Trailing Edge** - A distinct line at the rear edge of a slick that is recognized by spreading and dispersion of the oil.

**Unauthorized discharge of oil** means any actual or threatened discharge of oil not authorized by a federal or state permit.

**Vessel** includes every description of watercraft or other contrivance used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water, whether self-propelled or otherwise, including barges.

**Weathering** - Process of evaporation, dissolution, and dispersion which act on oil and effect its physical properties and its composition.

**Windrows** - Streaks of oil caused by wind that line up in the direction of the wind.

### **C. Boundary Map**

Under the OSPRA, the Coordinator is required to adopt a fully delineated inland boundary for coastal waters (LA RS 30:2459). The trustees and the Coordinator have produced a boundary map which delineates the limits of coastal waters and depicts waterborne transportation of oil on navigable waterways, as defined in the OSPRA '90, within the of the state of Louisiana. Official copies of this map are available at the LDNR/Office of Coastal Restoration and Management and the LOSCO. Additional copies are available for viewing at parish government offices, state libraries, trustee agencies and other sources.



## **Chapter 2. Statewide Response System and Policies**

### **A. Overview of Federal Oil Spill Response System and Policies**

#### **A.1 The National Response System**

The National Response System (NRS) was developed to coordinate all government agencies with responsibility for environmental protection in a focused response strategy for the immediate and effective cleanup of an oil or HAZMAT discharge. The NRS is a three tiered response and preparedness mechanism that supports the pre-designated Federal OSC in coordinating national, regional, local government agencies, industry, and the RP during response.

#### **A.2 National Response Policy**

Section 4201 of OPA 90 amended subsection C of section 311 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (FWPCA), to require the Federal OSC to in accordance with the NCP and any appropriate ACP, insure effective and immediate removal of a discharge, and mitigation or prevention of a substantial threat of a discharge, of oil or HAZMAT;

- (a) into or on the navigable waters;
- (b) on the adjoining shorelines to the navigable waters;
- (c) into on the waters of the EEZ; or
- (d) that may affect natural resources belonging to, appertaining to, or under the exclusive management authority of the U.S.

In carrying out these functions, the FOSC may:

- (a) remove or arrange for the removal of a discharge, and mitigate or prevent a substantial threat of a discharge, at any time;
- (b) direct or monitor all Federal, state, private actions to remove a discharge; and
- (c) recommend to the commandant that a vessel discharging or threatening to discharge be removed and, if necessary, destroyed.

Under OPA 90 the Federal government has the authority to direct response efforts to ensure the RP cleanup is satisfactory and timely. The FOSC has been designated as the Federal official responsible for ensuring an effective and immediate removal of a discharge, and mitigation or prevention of a substantial threat of a discharge of oil or HAZMAT. The FOSC's authority to direct response efforts applies for spills the FOSC deems to be a substantial threat to public health and welfare. In carrying out this responsibility, the FOSC may remove or arrange for removal of a discharge, mitigate or prevent a substantial threat of a discharge. The FOSC may direct or monitor all Federal, State and private actions to remove a discharge; and remove and, if necessary, request authority to destroy a vessel discharging, or threatening to discharge, by whatever means are available. In all actions, the FOSC must act in accordance with the NCP and ACP, or as directed by the President.

## **B. Statewide Response System and Policies-LOSCO**

### **B.1 The Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator**

Under 30:2462 the Coordinator, in consultation with the Department of Environmental Quality, is authorized to administer the OSPRA and direct all state discharge response and cleanup operations resulting from unauthorized or threatened discharges of oil, affecting or potentially affecting the land, coastal waters, or any other waters of Louisiana, as directed by the Governor or upon a declaration of emergency as declared by the Governor.

The Department of Environmental Quality, under the direction and control of the Coordinator, is lead technical agency of the state for response to actual or threatened unauthorized discharges of oil and for cleanup of pollution from unauthorized discharges of oil.

### **B.2 Role of the State On Scene Coordinator**

The responsibility of the LOSC is to insure that all agencies are performing their legislated mandates in a coordinated fashion without duplication. It is his responsibility to see that all agencies, local, state, and federal as well as all interested parties, e.g. responsible parties have a single point of reference with respect to the state's response efforts. The Coordinator may appoint a state-designated on-scene coordinator to act in his absence (R.S. 30:2464).

The Department of Environmental Quality, under the direction and control of the Coordinator, is the lead technical agency of the state for response to actual or threatened discharges of oil and for cleanup of pollution from unauthorized discharges of oil (R.S. 30:2462). However, under 30:2462, "in the event of an unauthorized discharge of oil, nothing in the OSPRA shall preclude the Department of Environmental Quality from, at the earliest time practicable, assuming response and cleanup duties for the discharge of oil pursuant to RS 30:2001 et seq., provided, however, the Coordinator is notified within 24 hours."

Notwithstanding any provisions contained in this plan or the OSPRA, the OSC recognizes that each of the trustee agencies has legislated mandates that it must fulfill regardless of any actions the OSC may direct or take himself during a response.

### **B.3 Role(s) of Trustee and Other Agencies**

Under OPA 90, the President, upon recommendation of the Governor, has designated the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator's Office, the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, and the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries as Natural Resource Trustees for the State of Louisiana. The Governor has designated the Oil Spill Coordinator as the lead administrative trustee.

In promulgating the plan, the Coordinator shall provide for clear designation of responsibilities and jurisdiction and avoid unnecessary duplication and expense. In promulgating the plan, the Coordinator shall also provide for participation by local political subdivisions contiguous to coastal waters.

### **B.4 Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality**

The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ) is the primary agency in the State concerned with environmental policies and regulations as set forth in the Louisiana Revised Statutes 30:2001 et seq. The LDEQ responds to all reported unauthorized discharges, emissions or other releases to the water, air and soil with the intent of providing protection of these natural resources to maintain a healthful environment for the citizens of the State. Specific response activities of the LDEQ relative to the Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act of

1991 (OSPR 91) may vary according to the size, extent and composition of a spill, and the degree of involvement of a responsible party, and local, state and federal agencies. LDEQ has trained all response personnel to the 40-hour Hazardous Waste Operations and Management level for activities relative to oil and hazardous material releases. In addition to spill response duties, LDEQ personnel review industry spill prevention and control plans, assist in oil and hazardous material spill drills, and inspect permitted facilities for compliance with applicable rules and regulations pursuant to the Louisiana Environmental Quality Act. The following are LDEQ duties relative to Louisiana's State Oil Spill Contingency Plan:

- (a) Maintains a notifications system for receipt of information on anticipated and actual unauthorized discharges.
- (b) Activates spill response procedures as necessary, including secondary notifications.
- (c) Acts as state on-scene coordinator for oil spills within Louisiana Coastal Waters in lieu of the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator's presence.
- (d) Determines the nature, extent and location of the spill.
- (e) Seeks to locate the source and cause of the spill and to identify the responsible party.
- (f) Tracks and predicts spill movements.
- (g) Evaluates the environmental implications of the spill and identifies priority areas for protection and cleanup in consultation with other State, Federal and local agencies.
- (h) Provides technical assistance to local emergency responders and advises on necessary protective actions.
- (i) Provides advice and regulatory oversight on a responsible party's preferred method of containment, abatement and cleanup, including temporary and ultimate storage, handling, transport and disposal methods.
- (j) Provides logistical support to state, local and federal agencies to the extent that resources allow.
- (k) Advises industry to ensure that cleanup is conducted appropriately.
- (l) Collects and analyzes air, water, soil, vegetation and/or tissue samples for assessing environmental damage and pursuing enforcement actions.
- (m) Monitors adequacy of response.
- (n) Documents aspects of the incident and subsequent response activities of involved parties.
- (o) Acts as a State Natural Resource Trustee for the protection of the designated resources of surface waters, ground waters, air and soil within the jurisdictional boundaries of Louisiana.
- (p) Provides liaison with federal, state and local agencies, adjacent countries, the private sector and the public as appropriate.
- (q) Participates in the formulation of contingency plans for the preparedness of a given local, state or federal agency or regulated entity to abate impacts due to a spill event.
- (r) Participates in spill drills for the purpose of assisting in the evaluation of adequacy of a given contingency plan.

#### B.5 Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries

Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF) is responsible for the control, supervision, management, protection and conservation of wildlife of the state, including all aquatic life; control over the beds and bottoms of certain water bodies; and control, protection, management of certain land owned or managed by the LDWF:

- (a) Serves as joint public trustee, designated by the Governor, for natural resources under the Oil Pollution Act of 1990. (33 USCA 2706(b)(3))
- (b) Assesses damages to natural resources under LWDF's trusteeship following an oil spill. (33 USCA 276(c)(2))
- (c) Works with the state oil spill Coordinator in response to unauthorized or threatened discharge of oil affecting or potentially affecting the land, coastal waters, or an other waters of Louisiana. (La. R.S. 30:2458(A))
- (d) Serves on the interagency council chaired by the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator. (La. R.S. 30:2458(A))
- (e) Recommends provisions of the state oil spill contingency plan relative to the protection, rescue, and rehabilitation of aquatic life and wildlife and appropriate habitats on which they depend. (La. R.S. 30:2459(A))
- (f) Cooperates with the oil spill Coordinator in establishing procedures for the oil spill contingency plan for the assessment of natural resource damages and plans for mitigation of damage to and restoration, protection, rehabilitation, or replacement of damaged natural resources. (La. R.S. 30:2460(A))
- (g) Prohibits (through commission action) the discharge of petroleum wastes into any waters off the coastline of Louisiana and extending there from three miles or more into the Gulf of Mexico to prevent damage to the aquatic life in the waters of the state. (La. R.S. 56:6(22))
- (h) Maintains general, overall control, supervision, conservation, protection, and management authority over the wildlife of the state, including all aquatic life. (La. Const. Art. 9, Section 7(A)), (La. R.S. 36:601(A)), (La. R.S. 36:602(B)), (La. R.S. 56:1(A)), (La. R.S. 56:3), (La. R.S. 56:6(15))
- (i) Participates in wetlands conservation and coastal zone management, restoration, and protection. (La. R.S. 36:609(B)), (La. R.S. 34:3113), (La. R.S. 49:213.5(A) & (B)), (La. R.S. 49:214.25(C)), (La. R.S. 49:214.27(B) and R.S. 49:214.28(D)), (La. R.S. 49:214.31), (La. R.S. 49:214.32)
- (j) Manages and protects public wildlife lands and natural areas and habitats, including water bottoms and river basins. (La. R.S. 36:609(B)), (La. R.S. 56:3), (La. R.S. 56:6(12), La. R.S. 56:434(F)), (La. R.S. 56:6(13), R.S. 56:6), R.S. 56:752, R.S. 56:761(A) & (B), R.S. 56:781, R.S. 56:795, et seq., R.S. 56:803(B) & (C)(1)), (La. R.S. 56:26, R.S. 56:109(A),(B), & (C), R.S. 56:1831), (La. R.S. 56:1864(7), R.S. 56:1868(A), R.S. 56:1921, La. R.S. 56:1925)
- (k) Manages, regulates and enforces the taking of wildlife and fishery resources.(La. R.S. 36:609), (La. R.S. 36.605(B), La. R.S. 56.6(14)), (La. R.S. 56:40.1, et seq.), (La. R.S. 56:493)
- (l) Conducts research and permits the conduct of research regarding fishery and wildlife resources. (La. R.S. 36:609), (La. R.S. 56:6(1)), (La. R.S. 56:611), (La. R.S. 56:318)
- (m) Advises/regulates water pollution and habitat destruction. (La. R.S. 56:632.6(B)), (La. R.S. 56:711), (La. R.S. 1840, et seq.), (La. R.S. 30:2093), (La. R.S. 30:2011(D)(20))
- (n) Participates in the development of the State's natural resources, including operating fish hatcheries. (La. R.S. 56:6(19)), (La. R.S. 56:315, R.S. 56:581)
- (o) Monitors collisions, accidents, or other casualties involving vessels. (La. R.S. 34:851.10(B)(C) and R.S. 34:851.29)
- (p) Conserves resident and threatened and endangered species of wildlife, and prohibits the taking of any threatened or endangered species in the state. (La. R.S. 56:1903, R.S. 56:1904(F)(1))

- (q) Reviews and comments to the Department of Environmental Quality on any environmental impact statements relative to fish and wildlife resources or their habitat. (La. R.S. 30:2021)

B.6 The Department of Natural Resources - Office of Coastal Restoration and Management

The Louisiana Department of Natural Resources/Office of Coastal Restoration and Management (LDNR/OCR&M) is the agency responsible for the implementation of the Coastal Vegetated Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Plan (R.S. 49:213.1). The OCR&M is mandated to develop and implement policies, plans, and programs to encourage multiple uses of the Coastal Zone and to achieve a proper balance between development and conservation, restoration, creation, and nourishment of renewable coastal resources (R.S. 49:213.1). The LDNR/OCR&M has the primary authority over those activities occurring on and uses of lands and water within the boundary set forth under La. R.S. 49:213.1 et seq., which have direct and significant impact, as defined in R.S. 49:214.24, on coastal waters, R.S. 49:214.25. The LDNR/OCR&M also has the authority to review, for consistency, with the Louisiana Coastal Resources Program (LCRP): those direct and indirect federal actions; and those actions licensed and/or permitted by federal agencies, both outside and within the coastal zone, which may significantly affect coastal resources/waters within the coastal zone(R.S. 49:214.32).

The LDNR/OCR&M incorporated Act 7, the Louisiana Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act, into the LCRP effective February 1996. For the purposes of federal consistency, the following are the enforceable policies incorporated into the program: R.S. 30:2452-2454, §2457, §§2459-2461, §§2463-2466, §§2469-2476, §§2478-2480, §§2485-2486, and §§2488-2489.

The Coastal Management Division (CMD) of the OCR&M is mandated to protect, develop, and where feasible, restore or enhance the resources of the state's Coastal Zone; to develop and implement a coastal resources management program which is based on consideration of our resources, the environment, the needs of the people of the state, the nation, and of state and local government; and to enhance opportunities for the use and enjoyment of the recreational values of the Coastal Zone (R.S. 49:214.22).

The Coastal Restoration Division (CRD) of the OCR&M is mandated to establish and monitor projects within the coastal zone boundary that conserve, enhance, restore, and create coastal vegetated wetlands in accordance with the Coastal Vegetated Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Plan (R.S. 49:214.4). The CRD is responsible for engineering and monitoring programs consistent with mandated associated with Act 6 of the Second Extraordinary Session of 1989 Louisiana Legislature.

The Louisiana Coastal Zone is defined as coastal waters and adjacent shorelands within the boundaries of the coastal zone established in R.S. 49:214.24., which are strongly influenced by each other, and in proximity to the shorelines, and uses of which have a direct and significant impact on coastal waters (R.S. 214.23(4); see attached map. Coastal waters shall mean bays, lakes, inlets, estuaries, rivers, bayous, and other bodies of water within the boundaries of the coastal zone which have measurable seawater content (under normal weather conditions over a period of years (R.S. 214.23(3). When used in the regulations of the Louisiana Coastal Resources Program (LCRP), wetlands shall be open water areas or areas that are inundated or saturated by surface or ground water at a frequency and duration sufficient to support, and under normal circumstances do support, a prevalence of vegetation typically adapted for life in

saturated soil conditions (Louisiana Coastal Resources Program Final Environmental Impact Statement, 1980 p.c6-3).

The Office of Coastal Restoration and Management:

- (a) Is authorized to be, in cooperation with the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator (LOSCO), the lead agency within the Department of Natural Resources in recommending provisions of the State Oil Spill Contingency Plan providing for protection and rehabilitation of appropriate resources under its jurisdiction (R.S. 30:2459.A);
- (b) Is represented by the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources or his designee on the Interagency Council established by the Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act (R.S. 30:2458.A.4);
- (c) Cooperates in the establishment of procedures for assessment of natural resource damages and plans for mitigation of damage to and restoration, protection, rehabilitation, or replacement of damaged natural resources. LDNR/OCR&M will be the lead advisory agency with respect to any procedures for the assessment of damages to and restoration, protection, rehabilitation or replacement of vegetated wetlands within the coastal zone. (R.S. 30:2460.A.14);
- (d) Assists other responding agencies by providing expertise, knowledge and information about critical areas, resources, and best alternative cleanup methods (R.S. 49:214 et seq.);
- (e) Provides, when to do so would not impair other functions of the office, logistical assistance of equipment and personnel to support the response, damage assessment and restoration operation and ensure the protection of resources;
- (f) Issues and enforces permits in the coastal zone in accordance with established guidelines (R.S. 49:214.27) (LAC 43:I.701-723) (1989) in connection with:
  - (1) levee construction (§703);
  - (2) linear facilities (§705);
  - (3) dredged spoil deposition (§707);
  - (4) shoreline modification (§709);
  - (5) surface alterations (§711);
  - (6) hydrologic and sediment transport modifications (§713);
  - (7) disposal of wastes (§715);
  - (8) alteration of waters draining into coastal waters (§717);
  - (9) oil, gas and other mineral activities (§719);
  - (10) avoiding adverse impacts to the coastal zone for any coastal activity (§701G);
- (g) Requires that effective environmental protection and emergency or contingency plans shall be developed and complied with for all mineral operations (LAC 43:I.719.K).
- (h) Requires that the use of dispersants, emulsifiers and other similar chemical agents on oil spills be prohibited without the prior approval of the Coast Guard or Environmental Protection Agency on-Scene Coordinator, in accordance with the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan (LAC 43:I.719.L).
- (i) Provides consistency reviews for any direct federal actions or permitted, licensed, or funded federal actions carried out by other persons pursuant to the consistency provisions of the LCRP and the federal Coastal Zone Management Act legislation.

- (j) Ensures that any governmental body undertaking, conducting, or supporting activities directly affecting the Louisiana Coastal Zone shall make certain that such activities shall be consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the Louisiana Coastal Management Program and any affected approved local coastal management program having geographical jurisdiction over the action (R.S. 49:214.32);
- (k) Notifies the appropriate representative of any parish that has an authorized Local Program in the event of an emergency brought about by natural or man-made causes that would result in hazard to life, loss of property, or damage to the environment if immediate action were not taken;
- (l) Issues emergency authorization for uses necessary to correct emergency situations brought about by natural or man-made causes that would result in hazard to life, loss of property, or damage to the environment if immediate action were not taken (LAC 43:I.723.B.3);
- (m) Receives all monies appropriated from the Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Fund and shall implement all programs and projects in the coastal vegetated wetlands conservation and restoration plan approved by the legislature (R.S. 49:214.4.B.1);
- (n) Develops procedures to evaluate new and improved coastal restoration and preservation technologies (R.S. 49:214.4.B.3);
- (o) Administers and manages project planning, design, construction, and monitoring (R.S. 49:213.7.E.1(c));
- (p) Operates and maintains structural projects [R.S. 49:213.7.E.1(d)].

#### B.8 Louisiana Office of Emergency Preparedness

The Louisiana Office of Emergency Preparedness (LOEP)

- (a) Operates the state emergency operation center;
- (b) Coordinates and provides logistic support during disaster emergencies, including communications, air, ground, and water transportation support, equipment and supplies, facilities, fuel and food, and assists with these functions for smaller spills at the request of the SOSOC.
- (c) Establishes, maintains, and staffs emergency equipment depots;
- (d) Establishes and trains a volunteer response corps;
- (e) Maintains the Louisiana Emergency Operation Plan;
- (f) Participates and oversees the development of local and interjurisdictional disaster plans;
- (g) Maintains a roster of trained personnel, skilled in disaster prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery;
- (h) Provides direct support to local communities in declared emergencies including spills.

#### B.9 Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals

The Department of Health and Hospitals (LDHH) directs and coordinates the state's emergency medical and health services. The authority of LDHH is found in the Sanitary Code of the state of Louisiana at R.S. 40:4 et seq. LDHH:

- (a) Evaluates incident implication for public health;
- (b) Recommends public health protection methods;

- (c) Determines status of medical services;
- (d) Determines availability and condition of health facilities;
- (e) Coordinates public health information;
- (f) Issues public health news releases and advisories;
- (g) Advises on response activities as they relate to public health;
- (h) Collects and analyzes samples to identify human health problems in coordination with LDEQ, LDWF, LDAF, as well as other state and Federal agencies;
- (i) Assesses damages to human health;
- (j) Responds to disease and sanitation problems caused by overcrowding and stress on facilities and systems;
- (k) Provides disaster mental health systems.

## Chapter 3. Organization

### A. Planning Organization

#### A.1 Overview of Federal Planning Organization

Under section 311 (d) of the Clean Water Act (CWA), as amended by section 4201 of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA), Public Law No. 101-380, and pursuant to authority delegated by the President in Executive Order (E.O.) No. 12777, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, in consultation with the member agencies of the National Response Team (NRT), has prepared the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan (NCP), 40 CFR part 300, which plan is the Federal government's blueprint for response to unauthorized discharges of oil. Some of the major goals include the expansion of prevention and preparedness activities and enhancing the response capabilities of the Federal government. One of the primary purposes of the NCP is to provide for efficient, coordinated, and effective action to minimize adverse impacts from oil discharges and hazardous substance releases.

This plan is intended to implement a strongly coordinated, multi-level national response strategy, which contains the framework for notification, communication, logistics, and responsibility for response to discharges of oil, including worst-case discharges, and discharges that pose a substantial threat to the public health or welfare of the United States. This plan calls for and develops the area contingency planning concept which divides the nation into geographic areas which are substantially similar and requires plans specific to those areas to be developed by Area Committees. These committees and plans are designed to improve coordination among the national, regional, and local planning levels and to enhance the availability of trained personnel, necessary equipment, and scientific support that may be needed to adequately address all discharges.

#### A.1.a National Response Team

The National Response Team (NRT) is responsible for national response and preparedness planning, for coordinating regional planning, and for providing policy guidance and support for the Regional Response Teams (RRTs). NRT membership consists of representatives from the USCG, EPA, FEMA, DOD, DOE, USDA, DOC, HHS, DOI, and DOS.

#### A.1.b Regional Response Team

Regional planning and coordination of preparedness and response actions is accomplished through the Regional Response Team (RRT). In the case of a discharge of oil, preparedness activities will be carried out in conjunction with Area Committees. The RRT agency membership parallel that of the NRT with one crucial difference, the RRT includes state and local representation in its membership. This team provides;

- (a) the appropriate regional mechanism for development and coordination of preparedness activities before a response action is taken and for coordination of assistance and advise to the OSC/RPM during such response actions,
- (b) Guidance to area committees, as appropriate, to insure inter-area consistency and consistency of individual ACPs with the RAP and NCP,
- (c) Recommend revisions of the NCP to the NRT, based on observations of response operations,
- (d) Review OSC actions to ensure that RCPs and ACPs are effective,
- (e) Encourage the state and local response community to improve its preparedness for response,

- (f) In coordination with area committees, conduct advance planning for use of dispersants, surface washing agents, surface collecting agents, surface burning agents, bioremediation agents, or other chemical agents according to Federal rules and regulations,
- (g) Be prepared to provide response resources to major discharges or releases outside the region,
- (h) Conduct or participate in training and exercises as necessary to encourage preparedness activities of the response community within the region,
- (i) Meet at least semi-annually to review response actions carried out during the preceding period, consider changes in RCPs, and recommend changes in ACPs,
- (j) Provide letter reports on RRT activities to the NRT twice a year, no later than January 31 and July 31. At a minimum, reports should summarize recent activities, organizational changes, operational concerns, and efforts to improve state and local coordination, and
- (k) Ensure maximum participation in the national exercise program for announced and unannounced exercises.

The two principal components of the RRT mechanism are a standing team, which consists of designated representatives from each participating Federal agency, state governments, and local governments (as agreed upon by the states),; and incident specific teams formed from the standing team when the RRT is activated for a response. On incident specific teams, participation by the RRT member agencies will relate to the technical nature of the incident and the geographic location. The standing teams jurisdiction corresponds to the standard Federal regions. In Louisiana this means the Region VI. The role of the standing RRT includes communications systems and procedures, training, evaluation, preparedness and related matters on a regional basis. It also includes coordination of Area Committees for those functions in areas within their respective regions, as appropriate.

The role of the incident specific team is determined by the operational requirements of the response to a specific discharge or release. Appropriate levels of activation and/or notification of the incident specific RRT, including participation by state and local governments, shall be determined by the designated RRT chair for the incident, based on the RAP. The incident specific RRT supports the designated OSC/RPM. The designated OSC/RPM directs response efforts and coordinates all other efforts at the scene of a discharge or release.

The representatives of the EPA and the USCG shall act as co-chairs of RRTs except when the RRT is activated. When the RRT is activated for response actions the chair shall be the member agency providing the OSC/RPM. The USCG is the predesignated OSC/RPM for all coastal areas as well as all navigable waters supporting commerce carrying 10,000 gallons or more of oil. The EPA is the predesignated OSC/RPM for all other waters of the US.

#### A.1.c Area Committee

The area committee represents the lowest level of Federal planning and response efforts in the event of a discharge or release. The area committee's are responsible for planning and response at the local level as well as the intermediary between the state and local governments and the next higher levels in the Federal planning process. Within the geographic scope of this contingency plan there are three USCG/MSOs. These are located at New Orleans, Morgan City, and Port Arthur, Texas. The area contingency plans for these MSOs have been formulated with input from the LOSCO as a member of each of the area committees.

## **A.2 Overview of Louisiana Oil Spill Planning Organization**

Under 30:2459 the LOSCO is mandated to develop and distribute a state oil spill contingency plan. The plan shall provide for clear designation of responsibilities and jurisdiction. Coordination with federal planning efforts occurs through the RRT and Area Committee frameworks. Coordination with local agencies occurs through the Louisiana Office of Emergency Preparedness in their role as liaison between LEPC's and the LOSC.

### **A.2.a Interagency Council**

The Interagency Council (IAC) was created by the OSPRA (R.S 30:2458) to assist the Coordinator in the development and implementation of the state's oil spill program. The IAC must convene at least twice annually. Its membership consists of

- (1) Four people, who are not legislators, one selected by each of the following:
  - (a) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Natural Resources;
  - (b) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Environmental Quality;
  - (c) The chairman of the House Committee on Natural Resources;
  - (d) The chairman of the House Committee on Appropriations.
- (2) The secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries or his designee.
- (3) The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections or his designee.
- (4) The secretary of the Department of Natural Resources or his designee.
- (5) The secretary of the Department of Environmental Quality or his designee.
- (6) The attorney general or his designee, who shall serve as a non-voting member.
- (7) The executive assistant for coastal activities in the Office of the Governor.
- (8) The executive assistant for environmental affairs in the Office of the Governor.
- (9) The assistant director of the office of emergency preparedness.
- (10) The Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator.

### **A.2.b Duties of the Interagency Council**

The council shall consider matters relating to the coordination of state prevention, response, and cleanup operations related to unauthorized discharges of oil, including but not limited to:

- (1) Assisting the Coordinator in the development of a statewide oil spill prevention and contingency plan.
- (2) Assisting the Coordinator in preparing and approving an annual work plan, identifying state agency needs which must be met in order to comply with the state oil spill contingency plan.
- (3) Developing recommendations for additional legislation.
- (4) Assisting the Coordinator in preparing and approving a budget necessary to implement the provisions of this Chapter.

## **B. Response Organization**

### **B.1 Overview of Federal Oil Spill Response Organization**

There are four area contingency plans that have been developed by the USCG (3) and EPA (1) which detail response mechanisms and procedures that the Federal agencies intend to use as blueprints for response efforts within the state. These plans are included and incorporated by reference to this plan. Copies of these plans are maintained in the LOSCO, the USCG MSO's, and EPA Region VI offices.

## B.2 Overview of the State Oil Spill Response Organization

Under R.S. 30:2464, the state response will be coordinated with Federal response as follows:

- (a) In responding to actual or threatened unauthorized discharges of oil, the Coordinator shall appoint a state-designated On-Scene Coordinator to act in the Coordinator's absence in the event the Coordinator is unable to be physically present at the scene of the discharge.
- (b) If the unauthorized discharge of oil is subject to the NCP, in responding to the discharge, the Coordinator or the state-designated on-scene coordinator shall act in accordance with the NCP as is practical under the circumstances and cooperate with the FOSC or other Federal agency or official exercising authority under the NCP.
- (c) The Coordinator or the state-designated On-Scene Coordinator may act independently to the extent no Federal OSC or authorized agency or official of the Federal government has assumed Federal authority to oversee, Coordinator, and direct response and cleanup operations.

## B.3 Incident Command System/Unified Command System (ICS/UCS)

The Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator's Office, in common with most major government and injury responders, follows the Incident Command/Unified Command system(ICS/UCS) for emergency response. The ICS/UCS is a method of organization whereby agencies/entities are predesignated to perform certain functions with reference to preparedness and response to discharges of oil. This system is used to ensure that predictable, appropriate actions are taken and that the lines of authority are formulated prior to the actual spill event. This is believed to be the most efficient use of resources, to preclude duplication of effort and confusion for responders, responsible parties, governmental entities and all others.

The Unified Command System mandates that the incident commanders for the Federal government, state government, and the Responsible Party function as a single command unit in the ICS. The various representatives of Federal, state, and local governments and the responsible party are then incorporated into the ICS structure as well, as integrated resources in the response effort.

## B.4 Federal Response Structure

The OSC is the pre-designated Federal official responsible for ensuring immediate and effective response to a discharge or threatened discharge of oil or a HAZMAT. The USCG designates FOSCs for the coastal zones, while the EPA designates FOSCs for the inland zones.

The first Federal official affiliated with an NRT member agency to arrive at the scene of a discharge should coordinate activities under the NCP and is authorized to initiate, in consultation with the FOSC, any necessary actions normally carried out by the FOSC until the arrival of the predesignated FOSC. This official may initiate Federal fund-financed actions only as authorized by the FOSC.

Where appropriate, the FOSC shall establish a UCS consisting of the FOSC, the State IC, and the RP Incident Manager. The FOSC is responsible for assigning individuals from within the response community (Federal, State, local, or private), as necessary, to fill the designated positions in the NRS incident level response organization. It should be noted, however, that one individual may fill several of the designated positions. These assignments will be predicated on

the nature of the spill and the need for extensive manning. These positions and their responsibilities are as follows:

- (a) Public Affairs Officer- coordinates the release of all media releases and the scheduling of press conferences related to the incident. The PAO may also establish a Joint Information Bureau (JIB) to facilitate the coordinated release of available information.
- (b) Liaison Officer- Coordinates with other agencies individuals, or groups involved in the response.
- (c) Safety Officer- Ensures the safety of all activities associated with the response and compliance with applicable safety laws and regulations. Also responsible for assessing hazardous and unsafe situations and developing measures for assuring personnel safety.
- (d) Historian- Records the chronology of events and documenting all pertinent activity relating to the spill. Pertinent message traffic, correspondence, etc. should be included in this documentation.
- (e) Response Operations Chief- manages the tactical response to the discharge, including containment and cleanup efforts.
- (f) Planning Chief- Develops strategies for the containment and cleanup of the discharge.
- (g) Logistics Chief- ensures that necessary personnel and equipment are obtained and delivered to conduct response operations.
- (h) Finance Chief- Manages fund expenditures, including documentation for claims and cost recovery. This position is typically staffed by a DRAT (see chapter 10.F.3.) or NPFC representative.

#### B.5 State Response Structure

The state policy requires state response personnel to participate as integrated resources in the UCS. Under a Unified Command scenario, various state agency representatives will fill slots in the UCS structure described in the previous section. The state response structure is described in detail in Chapter 4 under State Response Teams.

- (a) Command - The Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator or his designated representative will fill the State On-Scene Coordinator role during a response.
- (b) Operations Monitoring:
  - 1. The Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator or his designee is responsible for monitoring response operations. The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality responds to all reported unauthorized discharges, emissions or other releases to the water, air and soil with the intent of providing protection of these natural resources to maintain a healthful environment for the citizens of the State. Specific response activities of the LDEQ relative to the Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act of 1991 (OSPRA '91) may vary according to the size, extent and composition of a spill, and the degree of involvement of a responsible party, and local, state and federal agencies.
  - 2. Under 30: 2459, the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries is charged with recommending provisions of the plan providing for protection, rescue, and rehabilitation of aquatic life and wildlife and appropriate habitats on which they depend.
  - 3. Response actions are complete when the joint state and Federal agencies overseeing clean up agree that no more clean up should be done. Clean up shall be conducted as thoroughly as possible, but shall be terminated when, in the opinion of the on-scene Coordinators,

- a. There is no detectable oil in the water, or
- b. Further removal actions would cause more environmental harm than the oil that remains, or
- c. Cleanup measures would be excessively costly in view of their insignificant contribution to minimizing a threat to the public health, welfare, or the environment, or
- d. Actions required to repair unavoidable damage resulting from removal activities have been completed.

(c) Planning

- 1. The Natural Resource trustees are charged under R.S. 30: 2480 with the protection of natural resources in the event of an oil spill. The Natural Resource Response Team, working within the Planning section of the UCS takes on this function.
- 2. LDEQ and LDNR regulate disposal and storage for the state. Parishes also regulate waste disposal and storage facilities.
- 3. Non-Hazardous waste permits are obtained from DNR/OC. If the generator is known, a NON-Hazardous Oil Field Waste Hauling Ticket (manifest) must be completed. If the identity of the waste generator is not known, complete a UIC 23 in lieu of known generator.
- 4. Hazardous waste permits are obtained from DEQ. Once cleanup of an oil spill has begun, DEQ must be notified. All permits are completed by DEQ. When the waste is collected and put into containers, DEQ issues an EPA Provisional ID (PID) Number, which is used for one incident only. The EPA PID number allows for generation, transportation, and disposal of hazardous waste at an approved commercial waste disposal facility. The manifest system takes over tracking after disposal.

(d) Logistics

- 1. LOEP will be phased in the event of a SORS or SONS for procurement of materials for oil spill response on the part of the state. This agency has access to diverse resources which would be able to handle logistical support to any major oil spill response effort. In addition this agency maintains close coordination with various local emergency response entities/agencies.
- 2. The LOSCO's policy is that volunteers will be used for wildlife rehabilitation operations under the aegis of professional rescue and rehabilitation organizations. There is no other pre-ordained role for volunteers at this time.

(e) Finance

- 1. Finance issues can be handled by the staff of the LOSC; however, in the event of a SORS or a SONS, LOEP will track these issues for the state of Louisiana.

# ON-SCENE COORDINATOR (OSC) FUNCTIONAL ORGANIZATION

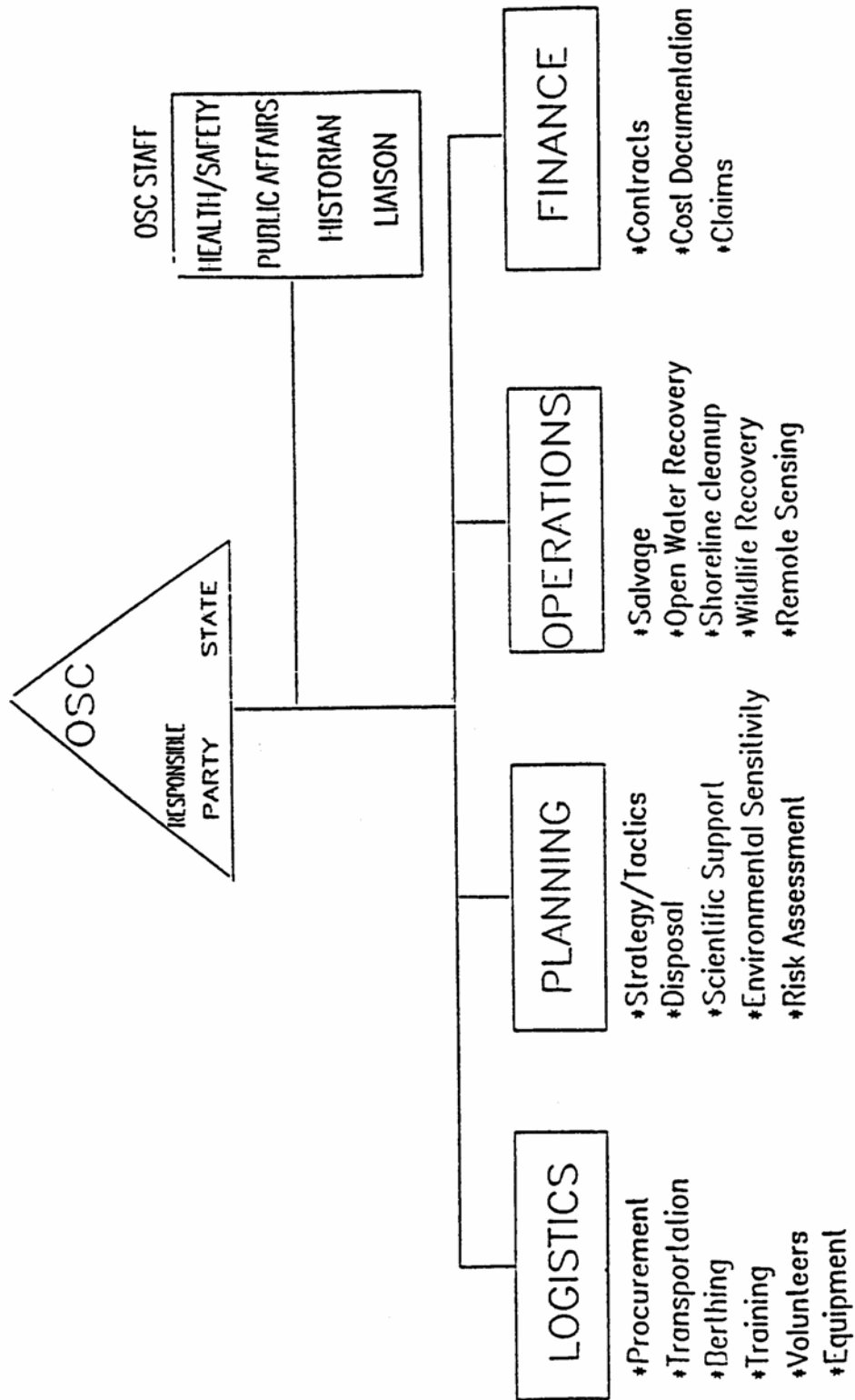


Figure 3.1 State Oil Spill Response structure

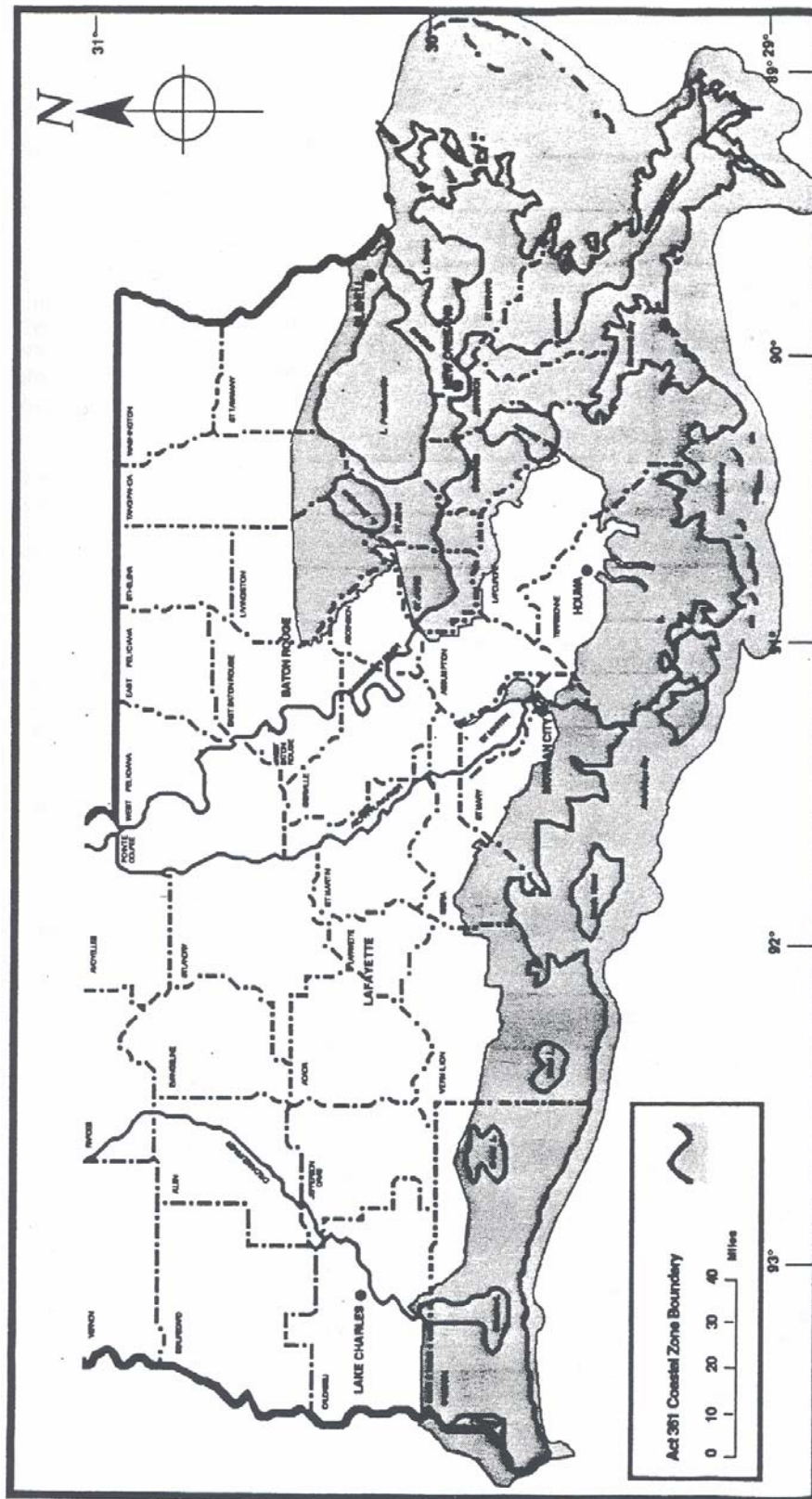


Figure 3.2 South Louisiana parishes and the Act 361 Coastal Zone Boundary



## **Chapter 4. State Response Teams**

### **A. Notification of spill**

Pursuant to the requirements of R.S. 30:2460 as well as R.S. 32:1501 et seq., R.S. 30:2025(J), and R.S. 30:2361 et seq., the state's designated hotline number is the National Response Center (NRC), in Washington D.C. (1-800-424-8802). Notification of NRC puts spill information into the Louisiana State Police Notification system, which includes the LOSCO, the Natural Resource agencies, and local Emergency Operations Centers.

Notification of the LOSCO hotline through the NRC does not relieve a responsible party from other legal requirements such as Community-Right-to-Know and those required under Title 33.

### **B. Response Teams**

#### **B.1 Mission**

There are several advisory groups whose mission is to provide information and recommendations to the State On Scene Coordinator (SOSC) on the potential for human impacts, resources at risk, shoreline protection priorities, and the need for operations oversight and Natural Resource Damage Assessment efforts to the SOSC. Under the SRT's guidance, other teams may be fielded to supply necessary support.

#### **B.2 State Natural Resource Response Team**

The State Natural Resource Response Team consists of the Louisiana Natural Resource Trustees as designated by the Governor under OPA 90: the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator's Office, the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, and the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. In addition, depending upon the location of a specific incident, the Department of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism and/or the Department of Agriculture and Forestry may have resources-at-risk.

Each Natural Resource Trustee agency will receive notification of every spill event. Upon notification of a spill, each team member will review the known information regarding the spill and potential resources at risk. He or she will evaluate the potential for impacts to natural resources under the jurisdiction of his/her agency. The team may advise the SOSC that no potential for injury exists. If, however, any team member determines that resources within his or her jurisdiction are at risk, he or she may request a team meeting or teleconference. The team may recommend a variety of actions including: an overflight, a request for more information from local personnel, mobilizing Resources Reconnaissance Teams, additional pre- or post- impact sampling, and/or beginning the NRDA preassessment procedures. In addition, the team will recommend response, protection, and/or assessment actions as appropriate. The team will continue to meet as long as necessary to advise the SOSC concerning resource reconnaissance efforts as well as impact monitoring efforts for cooperative natural resource information. In the event of a SORS or SONS, this team will be activated immediately.

At the discretion of the SOSC, the Natural Resources Response Team will gather where they can best advise him. The Natural Resources Team traditionally functions within the Planning Section in a Unified Command. However, because coordination with the Operations section is vital for implementation of natural resource protection strategies, the SOSC may designate a liaison to work between the Planning and Operations sections of an ICS. Thus, information should flow to the Command (the FOSC, SOSC and the RPOSC) from the integrated Planning section. This information will include plans for identifying, protecting, or

cleaning sensitive natural resources. It will also include plans for wildlife rescue and rehabilitation, collection of carcasses, etc. The SOSC, at his discretion may require additional lines of communication from the state natural resource trustees representatives.

The SOSC has a number of subgroups of Natural Resource experts he or she can call upon for information. These include the On-Site Initial Assessment Team, the Resources Reconnaissance Team, the NRDA teams, etc. These teams will be primarily staffed with resource specialists with local knowledge of the area of the spill.

**B.2.a On-Site Initial Assessment Team:**

This team is deployed to provide eyewitness feedback to the Command Center and comment on the effectiveness of countermeasures before all of the product has even washed ashore. These people will be versed in response technology as well as the physical constraints of the area in question.

**B.2.b Resources Reconnaissance Teams:**

The mission of these teams is to supply real time data on the spill event to the Incident Commander for use in determining clean up priorities and resource protection strategies. In addition, these teams will identify locations that require additional sampling.

**B.2.c NRDA teams:**

The mission of these teams is to supply appropriate information for assessment of injuries resulting from the unauthorized discharges of oil. See the section on NRDA for further information.

**B.3 Public Safety Response Team**

With reference to protection of life and property, the Oil Spill Coordinator receives advice and assistance from the State Public Safety Response team, consisting of the Department of Public Safety (Louisiana State Police), the Department of Health and Hospitals, the Department of Environmental Quality, the Department of Agriculture, and the Louisiana Office of Emergency Preparedness. He may also receive assistance from parish and municipal governmental agencies.

Under Louisiana's Right to Know law, the Louisiana State Police are responsible for notification of state and local officials concerned with the protection of human health and safety. These individuals have access to the SOSC through the UCS Planning Section. The LOEP will function as a liaison between the SOSC and local and state health and safety agencies. In the event of threat to public safety or a SORS or a SONS, the SOSC may formally activate this team to coordinate the emergency tasks under their respective jurisdictions or authorities.

**B.4 NRDA-Natural Resource Damage Assessment Teams**

**B.4.a Policy and Authority**

Section 1006(b) of OPA provides for the designation of Federal, state, Indian tribal, and foreign natural resource trustees to determine resource injuries, assess natural resource damages (including the reasonable costs of assessing damages), present a claim, recover damages, and develop and implement a plan for the restoration, rehabilitation, replacement, or acquisition of the equivalent of the injured natural resources under their trusteeship.

The Trustees already named in this document, the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Environmental Quality, and the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator's Office have been designated under OPA as the Natural Resource Trustees for the state of Louisiana. In addition, some resources are shared with Federal trustees, for example, the Department of Interior (including the US Fish and Wildlife Service and Minerals Management Service), the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (including the National Marine Fisheries Service). Representatives of these state and federal agencies, as well as representatives of the PRP, can participate in the NRDA process according to their independent assessment of injuries to resources under their jurisdiction.

The State Natural Resource Agencies can proceed under Federal regulations (the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act) and regulations promulgated under OPA 90 that address how injuries can be identified and quantified, and damages assessed. This may include mutually agreed upon assessments termed Cooperative Natural Resources Damage Assessments.

#### B.4.b Responsibilities of the Coordinator and the Trustees

Under OPA 90, the designated Natural Resource Trustees are charged with assessing natural resource damages and developing and implementing a plan for the restoration, rehabilitation, replacement, or acquisition of the equivalent, of the natural resources under their trusteeship. Under OSPRA (R.S. 30:2460 and R.S. 30:2480), the Oil Spill Coordinator is mandated to develop a plan for assessing natural resource damages, and given the right of rebuttable presumption. In addition, under §2480, the LOSCO is required to develop and promulgate NRDA regulations by 1 September 1996. Expedited, comprehensive, and any other mutually agreed upon assessment method are all allowed under this subsection.

#### B.4.c NRDA and Response

Under §2480(C)(5), the Trustees and "other interested parties" shall assess natural resource damages by considering the unique characteristics of the spill incident and the location of the natural resources affected. If the trustees and "other interested parties" agree that the injuries may warrant damage assessment activities, they are required to "initiate, within twenty-four hours after approval for access to the site by the on-scene coordinator, an actual field investigation which may include sampling and data collection." Thus, NRDA and response activities may occur simultaneously. While these activities may overlap in time and thus, may require logistical coordination, they are distinct from one another in both scope and purpose.

#### B.5 Interagency Inspection Team

Some kinds of spills, while they may not present an immediate threat to human life and property, nor an acute threat to the environment of the state, nonetheless threaten the resources of the state. Often these sites are well known to enforcement officials from state environmental regulators, such as DEQ and DNR, who have unsuccessfully attempted to enforce existing regulations. This multi-jurisdictional team, which is coordinated by LOSCO, can be activated at the request of any state or Federal regulatory agency. Its purpose is to enhance the enforcement capabilities of the state by cooperative inspection and enforcement. This team can be activated in support of pollution prevention, response, or recovery operations in order to provide full regulatory coordination to state and Federal agencies. This coordination is particularly important because of the complexity and overlap of state and Federal agency jurisdictions. Each agency brings a unique perspective and expertise, which one agency alone often does not possess. Participants can be from any environmental, biological, or natural resource regulatory agency.

### **C. Training**

LOSCO understands the need for training in the specifics of oil spill response. Currently, LOSCO sponsors 40 hour HAZWOPER certification training with the cooperation of National Marine Inc, at National's training center in Port Allen. Other programs addressing oil spill issues are also under development at the time of distribution of this plan.

## **Chapter 5. Administration and Finance**

### **A. Access to the Federal Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund**

Section 1012(d)(1) of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-380, hereafter referred to as OPA 90) provides that the President, upon request of the Governor of a State or his or her designated state official, may obligate the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund (Fund) for payment in an amount not to exceed \$ 250,000 per incident for removal costs consistent with the National Contingency Plan (NCP) (40 CFR 300). The removal costs must be required for the immediate removal of a discharge, or the mitigation or prevention of a substantial threat of discharge, of oil. Pursuant to the authority delegated to the Coast Guard in Executive Order 12777, the Coast Guard has published an interim regulation (33 CFR Part 133) to implement the provisions of section 1012(d)(1) of OPA 90.

#### **A.1 Purpose**

The purpose of this document is to provide technical operating procedures concerning eligibility, communications, financial management, and record keeping for States requesting access to the Fund, Federal On-Scene Coordinators (FOSC's), and Coast Guard (USCG) District staffs.

#### **A.2 Scope**

The technical operating procedures described herein apply specifically to requests for funding under section 1012(d)(1) of OPA 90. Funding under section 1012(d)(1) will herein be referred to as State Access. These technical operating procedures focus on information that is needed to support cost recovery efforts of the Coast Guard National Pollution Funds Center (NPFC). Refer to Figure 1 for a flowchart of the State Access process.

These procedures do not address the provisions of Section 1012(d)(2) of OPA 90 (e.g., advance agreements with individual States, advance payments from the Fund, or access to the Fund by political subdivisions of a State). These procedures are intended as a supplement to, and not as a substitute for, the regulations contained in 33 CFR Part 133. Compliance with 33 CFR 133 is required whenever utilizing State Access to the Fund. Nothing in this document supersedes the requirements of the NCP. Of particular note, the designated state official, in accordance with 33 CFR 133.5(b) and section 300.320(a)(6) of the NCP, assumes the responsibility for notifying the trustees of natural resources affected/potentially affected by the incident.

#### **A.3 Background**

State Access to the Fund provides a new avenue for States to receive Federal funds for immediate removal costs resulting from their response to actual or threatened discharges of oil. State Access does not supersede or preclude the use of existing Federal payment regimes. The State should not seek and will not receive payments for the same costs from more than one payment regime. Generally, there are two other payment regimes which the States may initiate to obtain Federal funding for oil spill incident removal actions.

#### A.4 Acting as the FOSC Contractor

State agencies may perform removal actions under the direct supervision of the FOSC. In these situations, the FOSC issues an Oil Spill Response Authorization to the State to establish a contractual relationship and obligate the Fund. With this method of funding the State is not limited to \$ 250,000 per incident, and the FOSC is actively directing the State's response actions.

#### A.5 Claims

Section 1012(a)(4) of OPA 90 authorizes use of the Fund for the payment of claims in accordance with section 1013 for uncompensated removal costs determined by the President to be consistent with the National Contingency Plan or uncompensated damages. Regulations describing claims procedures are found in 33 CFR Part 136. States may submit claims for uncompensated removal costs, which may include those salaries, equipment, and administrative costs directly related to a specific incident. A State may submit claims for removal costs directly to the Fund even if the responsible party is known. Claims other than for removal costs must first be submitted to the designated responsible party. Claims payments are not limited to \$ 250,000 per incident.

#### A.6 Additional Information

For additional information regarding these procedures or related subjects, State representatives, FOSCs, Coast Guard district staffs, and other interested parties are urged to contact the NPFC (see paragraph 13).

### **B. Requesting Funds**

#### B.1 Eligibility Considerations

Pursuant to 33 CFR 133.5, 133.7, and 133.13, the following will be evaluated by the FOSC when contacted by the State requesting funds under section 1012(d)(1):

- (a) Is the incident eligible for immediate removal under the Clean Water Act, as amended by OPA 90?
- (b) Is the substance discharged/threatening discharge oil?
- (c) Did the incident occur after August 18, 1990?
- (d) Is the aggregate amount of the request equal to or less than \$ 250,000?
- (e) Are the proposed actions consistent with the NCP (including 40 CFR 300.305(c)'s requirement that a reasonable effort is made to have the discharger voluntarily and promptly perform removal actions)?
- (f) Are the proposed level of response, proposed actions, and amounts requested appropriate for the circumstances?
- (g) Has the State the means to complete the immediate removal?

#### B.2 Costs incurred before FOSC contact

Immediate removal costs involving a specific oil discharge incident which, due to exigent circumstances, were incurred by the State prior to the initial request to the FOSC for State Access, are allowable under State Access if the FOSC determines that:

- (a) notification is timely;
- (b) the response was consistent with the magnitude of the incident; and
- (c) costs incurred were otherwise reasonable under the circumstances and in all other respects were allowable.

### B.3 Contacting the FOSC.

In accordance with 33 CFR 133.9, the Governor or designated State official (henceforth referred to as the State official) shall request access to the Fund from the FOSC who is pre-designated for the area of the incident. The best method for contacting the FOSC is the telephone, because it allows for discussions and conference-calling.

### B.4 Evaluation by FOSC.

Considering the NCP, 33 CFR 133.15, and the criteria in paragraph 2.A. above, the FOSC determines whether or not the proposed removal actions are eligible for funding. The FOSC may contact the NPFC case officer whenever questions arise. The decision by the FOSC is final. The FOSC may respond as follows:

If the FOSC concludes that the incident is not eligible for Federal removal under the NCP, that any of the criteria in paragraph 2.A. above are not met, or otherwise does not find State Access to be the appropriate removal mechanism for the incident, he/she will deny the request for State Access. The FOSC may conclude that the incident is eligible for removal under the NCP, but that a Federally led response is more appropriate to the situation. In this event, the FOSC may decide to utilize State resources through contract (see paragraph I.C.I.). Whenever a request for State Access is denied for any reason (including a decision for a Federally led response or a decision for no Federal response), the FOSC will, by the next business day following his/her decision, notify the NPFC Case Management Division (NPFC (cm)) and District (m) office, as appropriate, of the request and the specific reason(s) for denial.

If the FOSC concludes that all of the criteria in paragraph 2.A. above are fulfilled and that State Access to the Fund is the best method to address the incident, he/she may then approve the request for State Access and contact the cognizant Coast Guard District for assignment of a case-specific Federal

Project Number (FPN) and a removal action funding ceiling (ceiling). The FOSC is responsible for ensuring that the State official is expeditiously informed of the FPN/ceiling.

### B.5 Obligation of the fund and assignment of the Federal Project Number and Funding Ceiling.

The FOSC will pass the same information to the Coast Guard district representative that he/she would pass for other types of oil discharge responses when accessing the Fund. The FOSC identifies this as a State Access removal which he/she has approved, requests assignment of an FPN/ceiling, and provides the name and telephonic/electronic/postal mail contact information of the requesting State official. With the issuance of an FPN/ceiling for the incident, the Coast Guard has obligated the Fund for payment. All further communications by all parties regarding the oil discharge incident should include the FPN and ceiling.

The Fund is obligated for payment to the State and a cooperative agreement between the Coast Guard and the State is in effect when the Coast Guard district assigns the FPN and ceiling to the FOSC. At this point the State may begin incurring costs against the FPN/ceiling.

Not later than the next business day following the assignment of the FPN/ceiling to the FOSC, the Coast Guard district transmits an official Coast Guard message that announces the assignment of the FPN/ceiling. This message should include the NPFC, the FOSC, and the cognizant Regional Response Team (RRT) members as addressees, and should also be faxed to the cognizant State official. In addition to the information which is usually included in this type of notification, this message includes as a reference the telephone conference between the

FOSC and the Coast Guard district representative in which the FPN and ceiling were assigned, specifically notes that the funds were provided for State Access, and includes the telephonic, electronic, and mail contact information of the State official.

#### B.6 Raising the ceiling

Requests for raising the amount of the FPN's ceiling are made to the cognizant FOSC. The procedure is identical to that outlined in subparagraphs 2.A-E. above. Requests for a higher ceiling shall not raise the overall ceiling above the \$250,000/incident limit.

#### B.7 Oil Discharge Removal Authorization

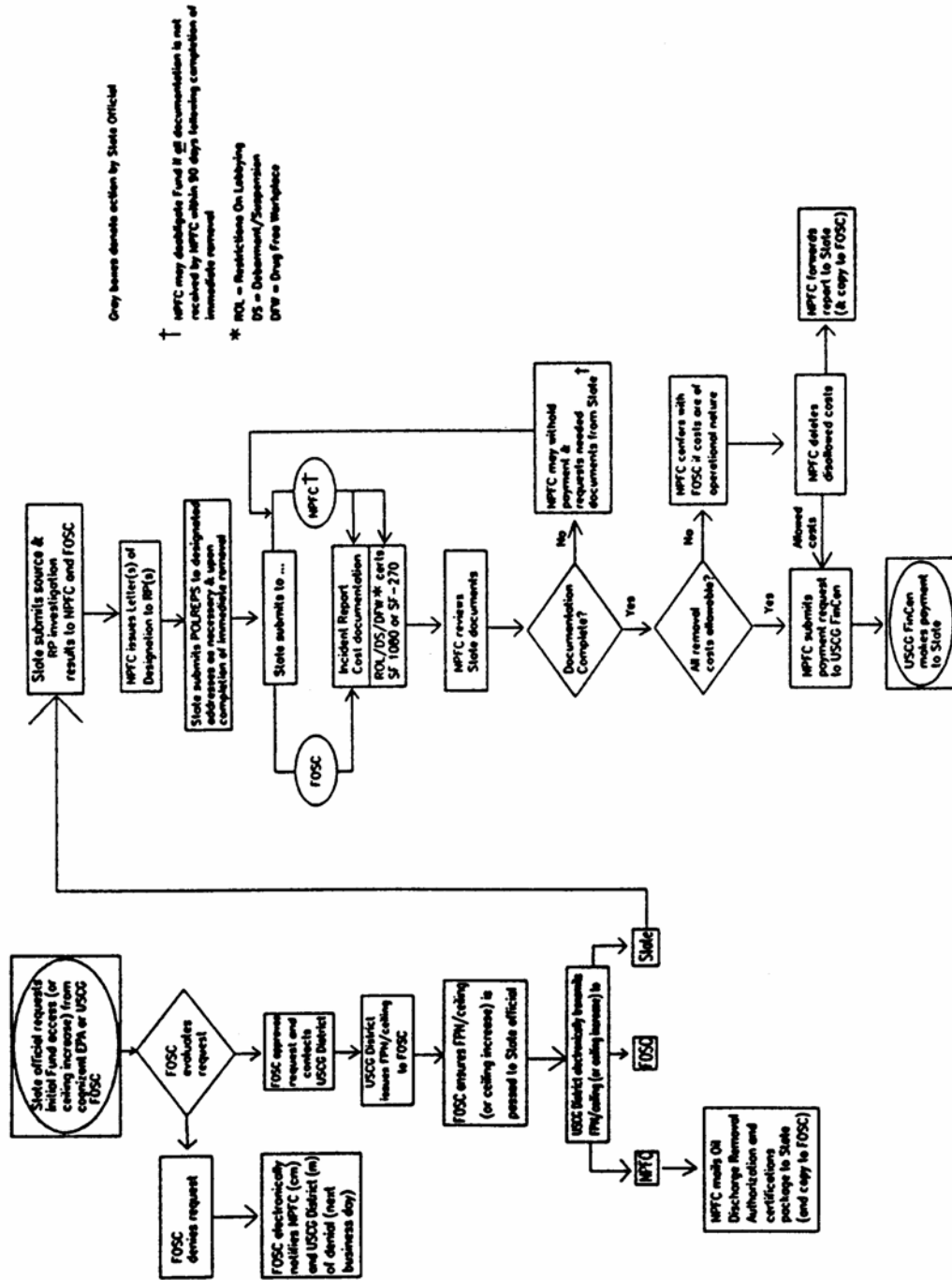
An Oil Discharge Removal Authorization (see Appendix A) documents the cooperative agreement between the State and the Coast Guard. Upon receipt from the cognizant Coast Guard district of the notification of the assignment of the FPN/ceiling, the NPFC case officer forwards the Oil Discharge Removal Authorization and a certifications package (see paragraph 7.D. below) to the State official. The State official should contact the NPFC case officer listed in the Authorization if any questions arise.

#### B.8 Termination of State Access Funding

If, at any time after approving a request for State Access, the FOSC determines that any of the criteria in paragraph 2.A. above were not/are no longer applicable to the immediate removal action, the FOSC may terminate State Access to the Fund. In this event, the State may receive payment for its allowable immediate removal costs that were incurred in good faith prior to the termination. While it is normally expected that the State official will notify the FOSC via POLREP (see paragraph 5 below) upon determination that the immediate removal is complete, the FOSC retains the authority to unilaterally declare completion of a Federal removal and terminate further Federal funding of the removal at any time the FOSC determines that immediate removal is complete

# State Access to OSLTF Under Sec. 1012(d)(1) of OPA 90 FLOW CHART

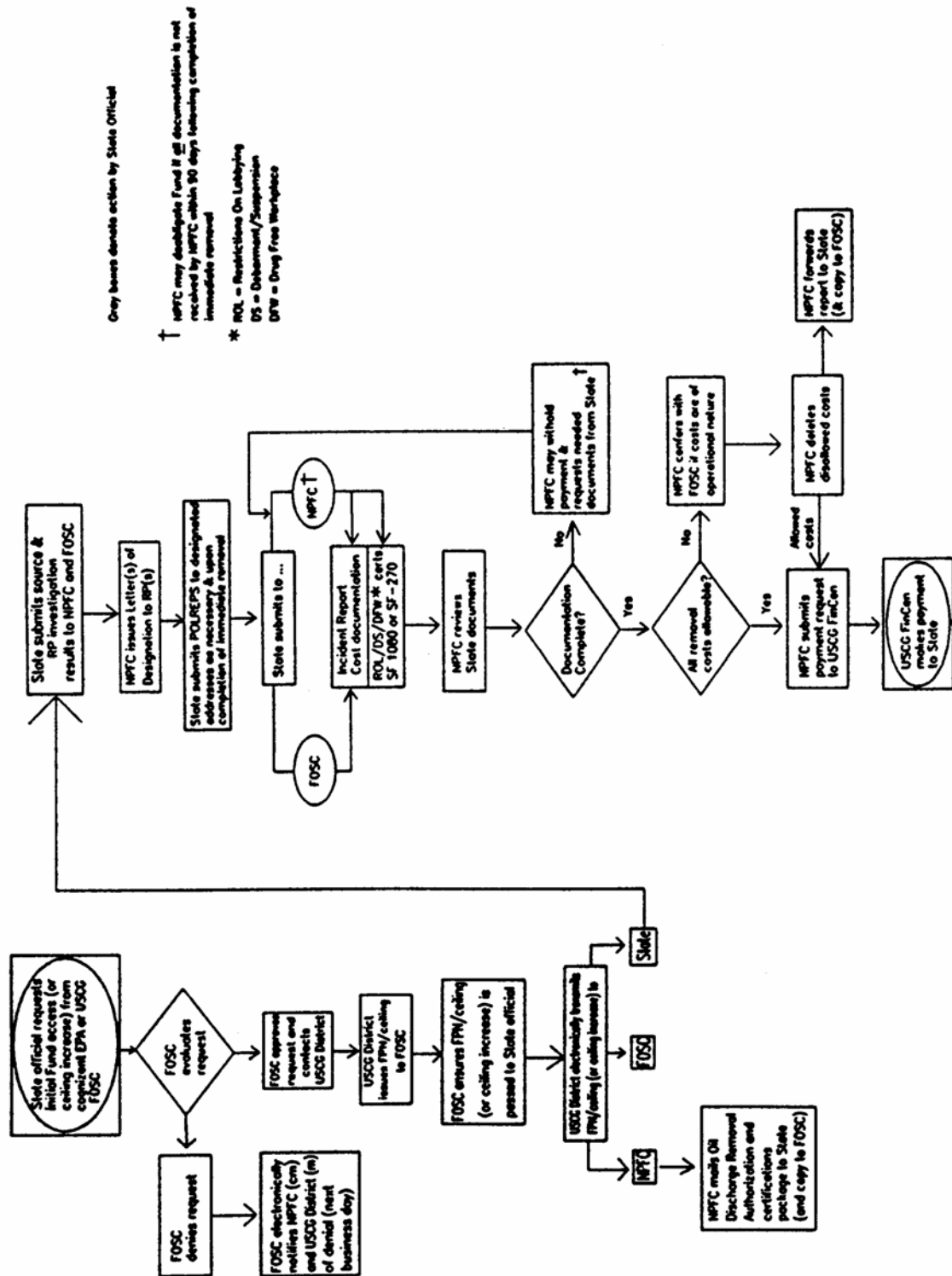


Figure 5.1 Sate Access to OSLTF flow chart

## **C. Designation of Source and Identification of Responsible Party**

### **C.1 Investigations and Notifications of NPFC**

In accordance with the Section 300.305 of the NCP and 33 CFR 133.23, the State shall promptly complete a thorough investigation to determine the source of discharge and to identify the responsible party(ies) (RP--normally, the owner or operator of the vessel or facility, including vehicles). The State should include this information in its POLREPs (see paragraph 5) and pass it directly to the NPFC case officer and FOSC via telephone as soon as it is known.

### **C.2 Letter of Designation**

Following receipt from the State of source and RP information, the NPFC case manager issues a Letter of Designation to the RP(s) to notify them of their designation as an RP and their responsibilities as an RP under Federal law. Also, the NPFC will send a copy of the Letter of Designation to the FOSC and State official.

## **D. Removal Costs**

Funds provided to the State under OPA 90 Section 1012(d)(1) are for immediate removal of a discharge or substantial threat of a discharge. Pursuant to OPA 90 Sections 1001(31) and 1012(a)(1), and 33 CFR 133.13, allowable removal costs are all direct costs incurred to prevent, minimize, and mitigate oil pollution from the specific incident, including the costs of monitoring removal actions taken by the responsible party(ies) and the costs to prepare required documentation. State Access may only be used to pay for removal costs that are directly related to the specific incident. Costs must generally be incurred at the site or in support of on-site activities. State Access to the Fund is for immediate removal costs only, and will not be utilized for long-term removal or remediation costs, nor the costs of natural resource damage assessments. If questions arise, contact the NPFC case manager. Allowable costs include:

### **D.1 Contract Costs**

The State may be paid for contract costs incurred specifically for the removal action (e.g., cleanup contractor costs, waste disposal contractor costs, administrative contractor costs (for on-site cost documentation), etc.).

### **D.2 Out of Pocket Expenses**

The State may also be paid for unbudgeted out-of-pocket State costs incurred specifically for the removal action, (e.g., OSHA and RCRA costs for the incident, travel to the site, consumable materials purchased specifically for the removal action, transportation or shipping costs for bringing materials to the site, equipment rentals, etc.).

### **D.3 State Salary, Equipment, and Overhead Costs**

The State may be paid for the salaries of personnel directly employed in the removal activities (including documenting those activities), the costs associated with the use of State equipment, and applicable overhead costs as may be applied in accordance with OMB Circular A-87. Incorporating the State's predetermined standard rates for the period of use (usually hours or days) is the preferred method.

## **E. Pollution Reports (POLREPs)**

The incident reporting requirements specified in 300.315 of the NCP apply to the State official during immediate removals conducted under 33 CFR 133.

### E.1 POLREP Contents

Each POLREP must clearly describe the source, location, situation, actions taken, and future plans. The POLREP shall identify the responsible party, if known. The POLREP should also note any potential damages incurred by third parties as a result of the incident which may give rise to claims under OPA 90. These may include private removal actions not funded through the Coast Guard; damages to natural resources or property (real or personal); loss of subsistence use of natural resources; loss of revenues by Federal, State, or local governments; loss of profits or earning capacity; and costs of State or local governments in providing increased or additional public services. The POLREP should cite the FPN and assigned ceiling and list the amount of obligations against that ceiling.

### E.2 POLREP Frequency

POLREPs are sent as significant developments occur during response actions, and a final POLREP should be sent within 48 hours following the completion of immediate removal actions. It is envisioned that removal actions conducted under State Access will typically be of short duration, and the State may only need to file one POLREP (i.e., POLREP One and Final).

### E.3 POLREP Communication

The State official shall submit POLREPs through communications networks or procedures established by the RRT. POLREPs are forwarded to the following:

- (a) FOSC who authorized the State Access request;
- (b) NPFC (cm);
- (c) RRT; and
- (d) others as specified in area/local contingency plans.

The POLREP should be delivered in writing by expeditious means (e.g., facsimile (fax), overnight mail, electronic mail, etc.) and may be provided by phone only when other expeditious means are unavailable.

## **F. Record keeping**

### **F.1.a Documenting Costs-General**

The State should clearly identify the costs of immediate removal activities, the need for incurring those costs, the source of the spill, the identity of the responsible parties, and the facts which support those conclusions. In accordance with 33 CFR Part 133.19 and Section 300.315 of the NCP, the State shall establish sufficient controls and procedures to provide documentation as follows:

- (a) Work/Purchase was Authorized -Provide documentation that the work or purchase was authorized, (e.g., contracts, travel orders, purchase orders, work orders, rental contracts, etc.). The documentation should indicate why that activity was necessary and show the relationship to the removal actions at the specific site. A supervisor's certification is sufficient for State direct labor costs.
- (b) Work/Purchase Received and Accepted -Provide documentation that the work or purchase was reviewed and accepted as complying with the authorization (e.g., receiving reports, delivery tickets with receipt signatures, ad hoc reports, etc.).
- (c) Billed for the work - Provide documentation of the cost of the work or purchase and that the State was properly billed for those costs, (e.g., contractor's/vendor's invoice, cash register receipts, travel reimbursement vouchers, employee timesheets or logs, etc.).

1. Work performed - The documentation should show the work performed - the service provided, the equipment used, the persons employed, etc. - and the quantity of each item of work performed each day (i.e., the delivered work product). Contractors performing work should prepare the documentation of the work performed. The State is responsible for ensuring the documentation of salary and equipment usage costs for the State.
2. Work unit -The documentation should identify costs according to the unit of work for each item. For contracts, that unit of work is established by the contract line items (CLIN).

**G. Required NFPC Forms**

The following forms/reports are required by 49 CFR 18, 20, and 29, have not been waived, and should be submitted concurrently with the Incident Report and cost documentation.

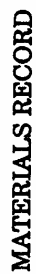

## **H. Louisiana Oil Spill Contingency Fund**

### **H.1.a Uses of the Fund**

Pursuant to Section 2484 of the Louisiana Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act (OSPRA) generally, and with respect to clean up and response specifically, money in the fund may be disbursed for the following purposes and no other.

- (a) Removal costs related to abatement and containment of actual or threatened discharges of oil incidental to unauthorized discharges of hazardous substances.
- (b) Removal costs and damages related to actual or threatened unauthorized discharges of oil as provided in the OSPRA.
- (c) Protection, assessment, restoration, rehabilitation, or replacement of or mitigation of damage to natural resources damaged by an unauthorized discharge of oil as provided in the OSPRA.
- (d) Operating costs and contracts for response and prevention as provided in the OSPRA not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars in any fiscal year.
- (e) Other costs and damages authorized in the OSPRA.

Under this chapter, the LOSC has set forth the procedures through which, an entity eligible to receive funds from, or be reimbursed for expenditures made, is able to gain access to the state oil spill contingency fund. Any state trustee or local governing authority seeking funds from the state oil spill contingency fund must submit all claims to the LOSC on LOSCO approved forms. Samples of these forms are found at the end of this section. Copies of these forms may be obtained from the LOSCO.

Pursuant to R.S. 30:24 88C, expenditures from the fund will not be authorized unless and until all Federal remedies have been exhausted pursuant to the section entitled, State Access to the fund. Access may only be used to pay for removal costs that are directly related to the specific incident. The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, which is the LOSC's lead technical advisor, will advise the LOSC of the standards/efforts necessary to complete cleanup. The Louisiana Department of Natural Resources/Office of Conservation will be the LOSC's lead technical advisor with respect to appropriate steps to abate the threat of a discharge or halt an ongoing release. Costs must generally be incurred at the site or in support of on-site activities. Access to the state fund is for the immediate removal costs only and will not be utilized for long-term removal or remediation costs.

### **H.1.b Natural Resource Damage Assessment**

Natural Resource Damage Assessments (NRDA) will be conducted pursuant to rules and regulations promulgated under authority granted under Act 740 of the 1995 legislative session. Pursuant to Act 740 these rules and regulations will be developed by 1996.

### **H.1.c Documentation and cost recovery procedures**

In the event that an entity, entitled to reimbursement from the state fund, discovers or is notified of the threat of a spill, an uncontained discreet release, or an ongoing uncontained release, it is the responsibility of that entity to notify the U.S. Coast Guard, the National Response Center, and the LOSCO. This entity must submit all appropriate necessary information for the LOSC to make a determination of eligibility. In order to make such a determination the following information must be provided.

- (a) evidence of notification;
- (b) evidence of Federal unwillingness or inability to respond;
- (c) evidence of unwillingness or inability of the responsible party to respond;

- (d) evidence that costs are not reimbursable from the Fisherman's Gear Compensation Fund;
- (e) a response plan is approved by the USCG and/or EPA and/or LDEQ;
- (f) estimate of costs to be incurred;
- (g) proposed cleanup contractors(s) (these organizations must all have appropriate certifications from the USCG unless and until the certifications are superseded by a process developed by the LOSC pursuant to R.S. 30:2457; and
- (h) estimate of costs necessary to complete response/cleanup.

Upon receipt of the above information the LOSC will notify the entity seeking funds of the eligibility of its request for funding. This determination will consist of the LOSC's determination of eligibility, the limits of funds that can be expended, and any special conditions attached to the expenditures. The entity receiving the determination of eligibility will be responsible for the following:

- (a) Contracting for all services needed according to all appropriate laws, rules, and regulations as specified by R.S.30:2465;
- (b) Oversight of all contract deliverables and certification that all tasks are accomplished as set out in contract;
- (c) An administrative record which includes all documents relative to the response;

In addition to performing contractual acquisition services the entity receiving the determination of eligibility will provide all of the following documentation items. These will be due to the LOSC within 60 days of completion of the response action which were included within the LOSC's determination of eligibility.

- (a) Copies of all invoices received from the contractor as well as a statement certifying that all expenditures were necessary and within the constraints of the determination of eligibility;
- (b) Reports detailing the progress of the response effort;
- (c) Any changes in the scope of the response effort that may be necessitated due to unforeseen or unpredicted events (before any monies are committed for these changes they must be, at a minimum, verbally approved by the LOSC).

The LOSC will, upon receipt of all cost documentation of the funded response seek reimbursement from the Federal Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund pursuant to all rules and regulations of the National Pollution Fund Center. All funds reimbursed to the state from the Federal fund will be deposited into the state oil spill trust fund.

Dear President Bush:

This letter is to inform you of a revision to the natural resource damage assessment process for the State of Louisiana. On April 23, 1991, the Louisiana Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act (OSPRA) which created the Office of the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator within the Governor's Office was signed into law. Pursuant to this law, the Coordinator shall establish the amount of natural resource damages caused by an oil spill in conjunction with the state-designated natural resource trustees.

Section 1006 of the federal Oil Pollution Act of 1990 states that "the Governor of each state shall designate state and local officials who may act on behalf of the public as trustee for natural resources under the Act and shall notify the President of the designation." Based on the legislative mandate of the OSPRA, I have designated the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator, Mr. Roland J. Guidry, as the principal state official for the assessment and restoration of damages to natural resources pursuant to the Oil Pollution Act of 1990.

The Department of Environmental Quality will act as the lead trustee agency for the recovery of all other natural resource damages. The Departments of Wildlife and Fisheries and Natural Resources are also designated as co-trustees for the recovery of damages to and the restoration of the natural resources under their respective jurisdictions.

We are confident the state will continue to have a consensus position as represented by these agencies. The designation of the Louisiana Oil Spill Coordinator as the lead trustee for oil spill events is important and is based on his


Figure 6.1 Letter of Appointment (page 1)

## **Chapter 7. Plan Review and Update Procedures**

### **A. Responsibility for update**

The LOSCO, with appropriate input from the IAC, all state trustees, and the general public is responsible for all updates to the SCP.

### **B. Annual Review**

The SCP will undergo an annual review. Recommendations for changes to the SCP are welcome at any time, but should be received on or before 1 June for possible incorporation in that year's revision. The revised plan will be published on the anniversary of the initial publication of the plan.

### **C. Changes to the Plan**

No changes to the plan will be made without the approval of the LOSEC and concurrence of the state trustees. All changes will be published in the official state journal and all appropriate response agencies will be notified.

Minor changes to the SCP will be made periodically and will include such things as names, addresses, and phone numbers of response agencies, contact persons etc. No changes in the substantive response policies of the SCP will be made without notification to and input from affected state agencies, state trustees, the IAC and the general public.

### **D. Changes to Resource Section**

As further information is gathered, pen and ink changes should be made in order to incorporate them into a revised version of this plan. It should be noted that each equipment roster has additional blanks on the reverse of the last page to allow for the addition of newly purchased or omitted equipment.

### **E. Changes to Living Documents**

Memoranda of Agreement between LOSCO and any other governmental agencies are considered to be living documents. When changes to those documents become necessary, LOSCO will follow the procedures included in the agreements themselves. Once any changes are ratified, the document will be re-published in any annual review.



## **Chapter 8. Training and Plan Implementation**

### **A. Training for Plan Implementation**

It is the policy of the LOSC that, to the extent practicable, all state trustees who will be required to respond as a team, will be trained as a team. Training will include but not be limited to, physical response techniques, incident command, unified command, damage assessment monitoring and data gathering and any other forms of operations in which response team members will be working together. Minimum levels of training for each activity type will conform to all applicable Federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations.

### **B. Exercising the Plan**

Because any plan is only as good as the ability to carry out its directives, the policy of the LOSCO is that the LSCP should be exercised with all response team members on a regular basis. LOSCO currently participates in PREP drills and other exercises coordinated by both government and industry. Additional exercises will be conducted for various aspects of the plan, e.g. communications, logistics, etc. on a regular basis. The extent of any one drill will be determined by the aspects of the plan which are chosen for that particular drill to emphasize. All Drills will be monitored for efficacy and all participants will be provided copies of drill critiques and reviews. This information will provide the basis upon which each agency and its response personnel are certified by the LOSCO to perform various levels of response to oils spills. No individuals, not properly trained, will be allowed to participate in activities for which they lack all necessary training.

### **C. Spill Response Drills**

To the extent that emergency response capabilities will not be compromised the LOSCO will provide advance notice of all spill drills. On occasion, unannounced drills will be necessary to insure that all response mechanisms are in place and operational in a real time mode. Notification exercises will also be carried out on an as needed basis to insure that all trustees and other response agencies are maintaining some state of readiness for response purposes. During any unannounced drill there will be at least one trustee apprised of the impending drill so that the trustee may act as a reviewer for the event.

### **D. Hazardous Waste Management Training Requirements**

Compliance with all applicable, Federal, state and local safety standards and training requirements will be demonstrated by each agency for its response personnel. Records of all training for these individuals will be maintained and copies of these will be forwarded to the LOSCO on an annual basis, during the annual review period for this plan.

## **Chapter 9. Oil Spill Response Organization Certification**

### **A. Current Policy**

The State of Louisiana does not currently have an OSRO certification program. Until such a program is developed and adopted, the state will accept USCG OSRO certification as adequate to perform work in Louisiana. A current list of USCG certified OSRO's is available from the USCG National Strike Force Coordination Center. A copy of this list appears in the Resources Section for reference only and should not necessarily be considered current.

Any OSRO interested in becoming certified should contact the NSFCC.

# Chapter 10. Resources

## A. How to Use the Resource Section

This chapter is a compilation of resources available from a variety of sources throughout Louisiana. In some instances, equipment and services from other parts of the United States are listed due to their specialized nature. The resources contained in this chapter have been proven time and again through experience to be a potential part of any oil spill response, recovery, or natural resource damage assessment.

This chapter has been arranged into seven major sections in order to categorize resources in a useful, organized manner. The first page of each section has a specific set of guidelines to help a resource manager understand and fully utilize that particular section. It is strongly recommended that personnel become familiar with this chapter's format prior to an oil spill incident in order to maximize its effectiveness. It is the intention of the LOSCO that each section should be tabbed upon receipt to increase its utility.

The lists of equipment and services found in this chapter should in no way be considered a complete list of available resources. Further, information contained in this chapter cannot be guaranteed to remain current. Provisions have been incorporated on each resource list for additions and revisions.

## **B. State Agencies**

This section contains lists of state owned equipment by department. It should be noted that only those agencies most likely to be involved in an oil spill response or natural resource damage assessments (NRDA) have been listed. It is entirely conceivable that other agencies may possess equipment, personnel, or services that may also be utilized.

Equipment rosters give general information for each piece of equipment complete with agency, office, telephone numbers, restrictions for use (if any), and location by city and parish. Additionally, location is also given by Coast Guard Captain of the Port Zone (COTP).

The absence of information in any block should not give the impression that information does not exist or is not important. It means only that that particular information was not supplied prior to printing. As further information is gathered, pen and ink changes should be made in order to incorporate them into a revised version of this plan. It should be noted that each agency roster has additional blanks on the reverse of the last page to allow for the addition of newly purchased or omitted equipment.

Abbreviations for the COTP Zones in Louisiana are, NO for New Orleans, MC for Morgan City, and PA for Port Arthur.

## C. Federal Agencies

This section contains lists of federal assets which are (a) geographically located within the State of Louisiana, (b) are under the operational command of a Coast Guard COTP Zone whose Area of Responsibility (AOR) includes a portion of the state of Louisiana or (c) resources which are held by the Coast Guard Gulf Strike Team in Mobile, Alabama.

Information is arranged alphabetically by COTP Zone. General information includes unit name, address, and telephone numbers, type of equipment, quantity, and restriction or capability. Careful attention should be paid to the 24 hour telephone numbers of the smaller, outlying units. After the normal working day many smaller units are not manned and the communications watches are shifted to a parent command.

The absence of information in any block should not give the impression that information does not exist or is not important. It means only that that particular information was not supplied prior to printing. As further information is gathered, pen and ink changes should be made in order to incorporate them into a revised version of this plan. It should be noted that each agency roster has additional blanks on the reverse of the last page to allow for the addition of newly purchased or omitted equipment.

While the U.S. Coast Guard is the only federal agency listed under this section, it is likely other agencies possess equipment, personnel, or services that may also be utilized.

Abbreviations for the COTP Zones in Louisiana are NO for New Orleans, MC for Morgan City, and PA for Port Arthur.

#### D. Coast Guard Certified Oil Spill Response Organizations (OSRO's)

This section contains lists of Coast Guard Certified Oil Spill Response Organizations (OSRO's) and equipment which are located within the State of Louisiana. This list was obtained from the Coast Guard National Strike Force Coordination Center (NSFCC) in Elizabeth City, North Carolina. While it is continuously updated, it should not be assumed that the enclosed version is the most current. A current version may be obtained through the NSFCC.

The first page of this section lists OSRO names, locations, COTP Zones, and telephone numbers. Additional spaces have been provided for pen and ink changes as they become necessary.

The OSRO resource categories are arranged alphabetically and generally follow the format provided by the NSFCC. General information includes the contractor by name and general specifications of the equipment. OSRO numbers are not used. An actual physical location by city and COTP Zone are given, as are any restrictions noted in the NSFCC database. However, unlike the NSFCC database, actual restrictions or capabilities are spelled out instead of using abbreviations or codes.

The absence of information in any block should not give the impression that information does not exist or is not important. It means only that that particular information was not supplied prior to printing. As further information is gathered, pen and ink changes should be made in order to incorporate them into a revised version of this plan. Additionally, it should be noted that each OSRO roster has additional blanks on the reverse of the last page to allow for the addition of newly purchased or omitted equipment.

Abbreviations for the COTP Zones in Louisiana are, NO for New Orleans, MC for Morgan City, and PA for Port Arthur.

## **G. Special Forces**

### **G.1 Coast Guard National Strike Force**

The National Strike Force (NSF) was created in 1973 as a Coast Guard staffed Special Force. This special force assists Federal On-scene Coordinator (FOSC) respond to potential and actual oil and hazardous material spills as directed by the National Contingency Plan (NCP). The NSF is a unique, highly trained cadre of Coast Guard professionals who maintain and rapidly deploy with specialized equipment in support of FOSC's preparation and response to oil and hazardous substance incidents in order to prevent adverse impact to the public and reduce environmental damage. NSF capabilities include:

- (1) responding with trained personnel and specialized equipment to prevent, contain and/or remove spills of oil and releases of hazardous substances;
- (2) providing spill management expertise;
- (3) assisting with response planning and consultation;
- (4) conducting operational training in oil and chemical spill response techniques and equipment usage;
- (5) coordinating, conducting, and evaluating the National Preparedness for Response Exercise Program (PREP);
- (6) identifying, locating, and assisting in the transportation of specialized equipment needed for spill response; and
- (7) providing support from the Public Information Assist Team (PIAT) to FOSC's during pollution responses.

The National Strike Force is composed of four units including three, 38 member Strike Teams.

- (1) Atlantic Strike Team located in Fort Dix, New Jersey, (609) 724-0008;
- (2) Gulf Strike Team located in Mobile, Alabama, (334) 639-6601;
- (3) Pacific Strike Team located in Novato, California (415) 883-3311.
- (4) National Strike Force Coordination Center (NSFCC) which is located in Elizabeth City, North Carolina at (919) 331-6000.

Upon receiving a request, personnel and equipment will be deployed to the scene in the most expeditious manner possible. This may involve over-the-road transport: all three Strike Teams have tractor-trailer rigs which give them rapid deployment capabilities. In the event air transportation of equipment is required, aircraft support will be coordinated by the appropriate Area Commander.

By requesting assistance from any one Strike Team, an FOSC immediately gains access to the entire National Strike Force personnel roster and equipment inventory. Each team maintains a state of readiness which enables them to dispatch two members immediately, four members within two hours, and up to twelve members within six hours as the circumstances of the incident dictate. Equipment would be dispatched within four hours of a request for assistance.

Since response support is time critical, early notification of Strike Team assistance of potential assistance will allow the teams to begin logistics planning even before a formal request is made.

## Logistical Considerations

Strike Teams make every effort to be as logistically independent as possible, however, assistance may be required from the FOSC in arranging the following support:

- (1) Heavy lifting equipment, such as cranes and forklifts capable of handling a 16,000 lb. containment barrier box;
- (2) Fork extensions for forklift;
- (3) Small boats, vessels of opportunity;
- (4) Tractor-trailer rigs;
- (5) Electrical power, landlines for telephones and computers, potable water supply and fuel supply for command posts.

Specific logistic needs will be clarified during the initial request for assistance and these needs vary, dependent upon the incident and location. Strike Teams attempt to minimize the incident and location. Strike Teams attempt to minimize the effort by the FOSC's staff required to arrange support. However, the local knowledge of the FOSC's staff may be relied upon by the Strike Teams to make reasonable decisions regarding logistics.

### G.2 U.S. Coast Guard Public Information Assist Team

The Public Information Assist Team (PIAT) is an element of the NFSCC staff which is available to assist OSC's to meet the demands for public information during a response or exercise. Its use is encouraged any time the OSC requires outside public affairs support. Requests for PIAT assistance may be made through the NSFCC (919) 331-6000.

### G.3 U.S. Coast Guard District Response Group and District Response Advisory Team

The District Response Group (DRG) is a framework within each Coast Guard District to organize district resources and assets to support USCG OSCs during a response to a pollution incident. DRGs assist the OSC by providing technical assistance, personnel, and equipment, including the Coast Guard pre-positioned equipment. Each DRG consists of all Coast Guard personnel and equipment within the district including the District Response Advisory Team (DRAT) that is available to provide support to the OSC in the event that a spill exceeds local response capabilities. The DRAT has personnel specifically trained in pollution fund management, equipment, and environmental assessment.

### G.4 U.S. Navy

The U.S. Navy (USN) is the Federal agency most knowledgeable and experienced in ship salvage, shipboard damage control, and diving. The USN has an extensive array of specialized equipment and personnel available for use in these areas as well as in specialized oil containment, collection, and removal equipment.

The Supervisor of Salvage (SUPSALV) can provide salvage expertise and maintains a warehouse on each coast stockpiled with salvage and response gear. Request for USN assistance is made through the OSC or RRT.

### G.5 NOAA Scientific Support Coordinator

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Scientific Support Coordinator's (SSC) are the principal advisor to the U.S. Coast Guard OSC for the scientific

issues, communication with the scientific community, and coordination of requests for assistance from State and Federal agencies regarding scientific issues. The SSC leads a scientific team and strives for a consensus on differing opinions are communicated to the OSC. The SSC can also assist the OSC with information relating to spill movements and trajectories. The NOAA SSC serves as the OSC's liaison between damage assessment data collection operations. The SSC leads the synthesis and integration of environmental information required for spill response decisions in support of the OSC, coordinating with the State representative, appropriate trustees and other knowledgeable local representatives.

#### **G.6      EPA Environmental Response Team**

The EPA's ERT has expertise in treatment, biology, chemistry, hydrology, geology, and engineering. The ERT can provide the OSC access to special equipment to deal with chemical releases, and can provide the OSC with advice concerning hazard evaluation, multimedia sampling and analysis, risk assessment, on site safety, cleanup techniques, water supply decontamination and protection, use of dispersants, environmental assessment, degree of cleanup required, and the disposal of contaminated materials. The ERT also offers various training courses to prepare response personnel.

#### **G.7      Agency for Toxic Substance and Disease Registry**

The Agency for Toxic Substance and Disease Registry (ATSDR) maintains appropriate disease/exposure registries, provides medical care and testing of individuals during public health emergencies, develops, maintains, and informs the public concerning the effects of toxic substances, maintains a list of restricted or closed areas due to contamination, conducts research examining the relationship between exposure and illness, and conducts health assessments at contaminated sites.

The ATSDR also assists the EPA in identifying most hazardous substances at CERCLA sites, develops guidelines for toxicological profiles of hazardous substances, and develops educational materials related to the health effects of toxic substances. ATSDR resources are an important tool for the OSC to use in assessing the possible effects of an environmental emergency on the public's health. ### **H. Cooperatives and Associations**

#### **H.1      Marine Spill Response Corporation**

The Marine Spill Response Corporation (MSRC) is a mutual benefit corporation organized exclusively to promote the welfare of the public by mitigating environmental damage to the coastal and certain upstream waters of the United States. MSRC accomplishes this goal by rendering its best efforts to assist the person responsible for the cleanup to contain, cleanup, and mitigate oil spills determined to be in excess of local response capability. MSRC has in place five regional (nationwide) response centers and various pre-positioned sites.

MSRC response resources were acquired with grants provided by the Marine Preservation Association (MPA). MPA is an independent, not-for-profit corporation whose members include oil companies, shippers, and receivers of oil, and others who pay dues based upon the amount of oil they handle in the marine environment. MPA members have entered into contracts with MSRC for certain response resources that they may cite as contracted resources in their state and Federal spill contingency plans. MSRC generally may not be cited for average most probable spills because these spills are within local capability and the applicable rules have response time requirements which MSRC is not designed or equipped to meet.

Information on the type, amount, storage location, and other details regarding MSRC's resources made available under the MSRC Service Agreement appear in MSRC's application for Oil Spill Removal Organization (OSRO) Classification submitted to the U.S. Coast Guard. Copies of this application are available upon request from MSRC. The OSRO application contains a description of MSRC resources available to meet U.S. Coast Guard response planning requirements.

MSRC may respond to spills beyond local capability of non-members through an agreement with the U.S. Government or if the spill is under 1,200 barrels, directly with a non-member by providing response equipment and/or equipment operator/maintenance personnel only.

## H.2 Clean Gulf Associates

Clean Gulf Associates (CGA) is an industry cooperative formed by Gulf of Mexico oil producing companies. Their cooperation has resulted in an impressive array of state-of-the-art spill containment and recovery equipment being staged at several locations throughout Louisiana. This equipment is available to association members at a very low rate, or to non-members for a significantly higher rate. The U.S. Coast Guard may procure CGA equipment by contracting through Haliburton Services and will be charged the non-member rate.

## H.3 National Response Corporation

The National Response Corporation (NRC), a wholly owned subsidiary of SEACOR Holdings, Inc. (NASDAQ:CKOR), is a for profit national Oil Spill Removal Organization (OSRO) which provides emergency spill response and regulatory compliance services to the oil and shipping industries worldwide. NRC holds a USCG classification, Level "E", in the Rivers/Canals, Inland/Nearshore and Offshore/Open Ocean operating environments as defined by the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA'90).

NRC's unique and cost conscious approach is supported by in-house expertise,, a vast amount of specialized response resources and a highly skilled Independent Contractor Network (ICN). Presently, the ICN is comprised of 54 emergency response and spill clean-up companies located in over 130 locations throughout our Area of Service. Responses are initiated through NRC's International Operations Center (IOC), which is manned 24 hours a day, seven days a week by full-time NRC employees. This organizational structure and pool of available resources allows NRC to mount a massive response, as necessary, through the cascading of personnel and equipment to the site of the incident. Once on-scene, NRC's logistics and communications specialists ensure that the entire response effort progresses efficiently and cost effectively. As a leading national OSRO, NRC offers proven experience with successful response operations to over 140 oil spills.

In addition to proven response and compliance services, NRC provides a wide array of value added services to our Clients, who include Shipowners, Barge Operators, Refiners, Terminals, Utilities, Pipelines and Offshore Production Platforms from 43 countries around the world. Presently, NRC is listed in over 2,500 spill response plans filed with both the U.S. Coast Guard and U.S. EPA as the plan holder's primary and contractual OSRO.

#### H.4 Strategic Petroleum Reserve

The Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR) is operated under contract by Boeing Petroleum Services, Inc. It maintains oil pollution response equipment at Weeks Island. This equipment is available to the pre-designated FOSC on a cost reimbursement basis in the event of a spill that exceeds the capabilities of commercial contractors and other resources.
